"Thanks, Tom," said Joe, "I would like to have them."


Immediately, the sense of tension faded away. Both of them, if they would have acknowledged it, felt that the air had cleared and they were once more on a friendly basis.

The Second Coming of Christ

Steps Toward the Attaining of the Consciousness Which was in Christ Jesus

And when they had brought their ships to land, they forsook all, and followed him.

And it came to pass, when he was in a certain city, behold, there came a man full of leprosy to him, beseeching him, and kneeling down to him, worshipped him, and fell on his face, and besought him, saying, Lord if thou wilt, thou canst make me clean. And Jesus, moved with compassion, put forth his hand, and touched him, and saith unto him: I will; be thou clean.

LEPER worshipped Jesus and prayed to be healed. "I WILL," spoken by Jesus, signifies the human will tuned in with God's all-powerful will. Jesus, by the word "I," did not refer to the limited human ego, but He referred to His soul as unified with the Spirit. Human will is circumscribed by the body. It can do anything to the body; it can keep the body well or plunge it into the abyss, destroying it. The human will, by application, can work changes in the world in a limited way, but when the human will identifies itself with God's will in ecstatic meditation, then it becomes God's omnipresent will, able to work in all the channels of

force and the avenues of power which govern the universe. It is then that the devotee, with his magnified will, can work any change in his extended cosmic body of the universe, even as a man can will to work through all the nerves and muscles of his own body.

Jesus, being one with the omnipresent Father and cosmic energy, felt His presence in the body of the leper. And with His omnipresent will, which controlled cosmic energy, He willed the energy in the leper to change the leprous body into a healthy body.

The human body is condensed energy and the will of Jesus, being in control of all omnipresent energy, could effect the change from a leprous condensed energy, or leprous body, to a perfect condensed energy, or perfect body. He willed cosmic energy to clean out all imperfections and to rearrange the life vibrations and create atomic changes into a perfect body. The leper was healed, and Jesus said to him:

See thou say nothing to any man: but go thy way, show thyself to the priest, and offer for thy cleansing those things which Moses commanded, for a testimony unto them.

Jesus told the leper not to waste time telling everybody about the divine healing, but to tell only the hypocritical priests who commercialized religion and did not live it in daily life. Jesus, in a way, through His miracle of healing the leper, hinted to the priests what they could do if they were really spiritual and did not merely profess being so. Jesus believed in the greatness of Moses and so He asked the leper to offer to the temple those cleansing things which were commanded by Moses, as a testimony of God's healing.

But he went out, and began to publish it much, and to blaze abroad the matter. And great multitudes came together to hear, and to be healed by him of their infirmities, insomuch that Jesus could no more openly enter into the city, but was without in desert places: and he withdrew himself into the wilderness, and prayed. And they came to him from every quarter. And again he entered into Capernaum for some days: and it was noised that he was in the house. And straightway many were gathered together, insomuch that there was no room to receive them, no, not so much as about the door: and he preached the word unto them.

And it came to pass on a certain day, as he was teaching, that there were Pharisees and doctors of the law sitting by, which were come out of every town of Galilee, and Judea, and Jerusalem: and the power of the Lord was present to heal them.

And, behold, men brought in a bed a man which was taken with a palsy; which was borne of four. And they sought means to bring him in, and to lay him before him. And when they could not find by what way they might bring him in, nigh unto him, because of the multitude, they went upon the housetop, and uncovered the roof where he was: and when they had broken it up, they let him down through the tiling with his couch wherein the sick of the palsy lay, into the midst before Iesus. When Jesus saw their faith, he said unto the sick of the palsy: "Son, be of good cheer: thy sins be forgiven thee."

The healed leper became the best

publicity agent of Jesus, so that great multitudes sought to be healed by Him. Jesus could no more openly enter cities and so He withdrew Himself into the wilderness of the desert, and into the wilderness of His inner Being, where no restless thoughts ever dared to disturb Him—and there He communed with God.

When He came to Capernaum for seven days, people heard about Him and His room became overcrowded. Many Pharisees and doctors of the law from Galilee, Judea, and Jerusalem came to see Jesus, and four men, being unable to get to Him, broke open the roof of the house where He was and let down the man suffering with palsy. Jesus, seeing their faith, said unto the sick man: Son, be of good cheer: thy sins be forgiven thee.

Son, be delighted in Spirit, for thy sickness (which is due to some pre-natal and post-natal sins, consciously or unconsciously practiced by thee, but unknown to thee now, and which are forgiven by the mercy of God) is healed.

Every sinful action leaves a sinful seed or tendency in the brain, which later sprouts into some mental or physical calamity when the conditions of evil actions are favorable.

Just as a needle, when it strikes the grooves of a record, plays a certain song, so also, the needle of an evil action, when it touches a grooved evil tendency in the brain, brings forth the corresponding song of evil experience.

Every experience, good or bad, if intense, leaves a mental and physical record in the brain. This mental and grooved physical record in the brain can be played at any time by the suitable needle of specific association of ideas.

Divine men, like Jesus, can with will and cosmic energy burn from any man the mental and physical records of sin which keep on singing the fruition of sinful calamities. With the burning of the inner sinful records, the miseryproducing songs of evil experience disappear also. This is what Jesus meant by "forgiveness of sins," when He healed the man stricken with palsy.

Consequently, man, who is the unchanging, unconquerable soul-nomad, turns out to be a changing, sorrowing tool in the hands of ever-changeable circumstances. That is the root cause of trouble in the human family. True escape for man lies in regaining his freedom by mentally dissociating himself from what he has or sees around him. Half of human miseries will disappear like phantoms as soon as man realizes that God is the Cause of all things.

But it had not been the wise constructive love that makes a child conscious of its own responsibilities. She had lived her daughter's life completely until the girl was fourteen, and then Mary rebelled.

No one could blame the girl.

"I intended to make a lady out of her," the mother went on hopelessly.

"She's never had to put her hands in dish water, nor make a bed. I had an income then. That has all been wiped out in the depression. About a year ago I was compelled to seek work. I took over a small apartment house. Being unable to hire help, I've been forced to do all the work myself. It is more than I am physically able to accomplish."

"And the girl refuses to aid you?" the man asked.

"Not a hand will she turn," was the bitter reply.

"And what does she say when you

ask her to help you?"

"She just jumps up and down in rage and abuses me with every vile word she can lay her tongue to. And if I remind her of all my sacrifices for her, she tells me that she didn't ask to be born; that she didn't have a thing to say about it; that she was just a victim to my own desires; and that she was forced into birth without her consent."

"Ah!" So that's the way the wind blows, eh?" The man leaned back and stroked his chin reflectively. "I wonder if I could have a short chat with this daughter of yours. I think it is just possible that I can put a little sense in

that pretty head of hers."

And so it was arranged for him to see her-alone. Although he was sympathetic, the girl was obviously on the defensive. A half-sneer played at the corners of her bright red lips. Behind a pair of mascaraed lashes, her gray eyes snapped defiance. He smiled inwardly. "A lot of spirit in that little temple," he said under his breath. "Too bad it's had to be wasted through all these years. She waited for his critical words of her conduct-waited for the chance to hurl back his challenge. But he was far too wise to give her the opening she sought. Instead he told her a story or two, quite in the manner her own father might have told them, had he lived to tell stories to his child. Watching closely, he saw the rebellious tension go out of her soul.

Casually and quite indirectly he referred to the story of Christ's birth. "You know," he said, "Jesus chose His Own mother, and being a wise man, He chose wisely. Mary made a wonderful mother for Him. And He knew she would long before He selected Her for the blessed event."

As he talked, the girl was as still as meditation. Eventually he paused at the end of his story.

"Do you really think Jesus chose His own mother?" she asked.

"Every soul revolving on the wheel of rebirth does that," he replied, in a tone carrying the convincing proof born of matter-of-factness."

"I had never thought of it that way," she said quietly.

Uncooked and Without Sugar

YUM-YUM

4 oz. figs.

4 oz. dates.

4 oz. raisins

4 oz. honey

2 walnuts

2 oz. pecans

Cut figs in pieces, mix dried fruits and nuts thoroughly together and run through food chopper, then add honey, blending it well into the mass. Roll out, cut into squares and wrap in waxed paper. (Mrs. Richter).

UNCOOKED PLUM PUDDING

1 oz. each dried figs, pitted dates, and prunes

2 oz. raisins

1 oz. walnuts or pecans

Mix all in together, then run through

food chopper.

Add 1/8 tsp. each cinnamon, nutmeg, and grated dried orange peel, working well into the mass, and form into pudding shape.

During the holidays these are nice wrapped in waxed paper and tied with

Christmas ribbons.

COCOANUT-HONEY CARAMEL

Work into candied or solidified honey as much cocoanut as it will contain. Roll out and form into squares. Wrap in waxed paper. (Mrs. Richter).

CHOP-STICKS

3 lbs. seeded dates

14 lb. walnuts

1/4 lb. shredded cocoanut

1/6 lb. dried bananas

Cut the bananas in inch pieces, mix all ingredients well together and run through food chopper, using fine cutter. Roll into sticks 4 inches long, which should be wrapped in waxed paper.

PEANUT BUTTER CONFECTION.

1 lb. seeded dates.

1 tbs. peanut butter.

Put dates through food chopper, using fine cutter, and work into them the peanut butter. Roll out and cut into squares. (Mrs. Richter).

HEALTH CONFECTIONS

The following recipes are from Dr. P. Lovell and are listed as laxative candies:

COCOANUT-RAISIN CARAMEL

1 lb. seedless raisins

1/4 lb. shredded cocoanut

Mix well and run through food chopper. Roll out and cut into squares.

STUFFED DATES

Remove pits carefully without mangling the dates. Fill with walnut or with pecan meats or cocoanut honey mixture.

Prunes may be treated the same way.

FRUIT ROLL

Put through the grinder together raisins and unsulphured black figs that have been carefully washed. Roll out into a flat sheet. Put through the grinder separately dried peaches, pears or apricots. Put dates and prunes through together. Now, over the flat sheet, spread a layer of the peaches, then the pears or apricots, and over that, the dates and prunes mixed. Roll up. Let stand several hours. Then slice in quarter or halfinch slices.

FRUIT CANDY

One pound dried, soaked but uncooked prunes, one pound dates, one pound black mission figs, one-half pound raisins, chopped nuts and grated cocoanut. Put all through food chopper. Mix with honey. Roll in cocoanut and put meats on top.

FRUIT COCKTAIL.

12 sections orange

12 sections grapefruit

12 cherries or grapes

2 tablespoons lime juice

2 tablespoons pineapple juice Combine, chill and serve.

CREAM OF BEET SOUP.

I cup finely chopped cooked beets

I tablespoon melted butter

2 cups boiling savita, or vegex, stock, (boiling water and vegetable seasoning)

1/4 cup tomato soup

1 small onion, finely chopped

2/3 cup evaporated milk Vegetized salt

Cook the onions in the butter until soft and yellow. Add stock to onion, then add remaining ingredients. Cover and simmer for 10 minutes.

TOMATO SANDWICH SALAD

6 ripe tomatoes

1 package cream cheese

1 tablespoon chopped green

1/2 teaspoon chopped onion Lettuce or cress

Peel, chill and cut the tomatoes in halves. Blend cheese, pepper and onion and spread the mixture between the tomato halves. Garnish with a sprig of cress or parsley on top. Arrange on crisp lettuce or cress and serve with well seasoned French dressing.

DIET AND HEALTH.

It is generally recognized that there is a very close relationship between right food and good health. Many modern doctors say that diet is the largest single factor in gaining and maintaining Sir William Osler, the great surgeon, says concerning the relation of eating to health, that "Ninety per cent of all conditions, outside of acute infection, contagious disease, and traumatisms, are directly traceable to diet."

In order to function harmoniously and to have perfect health and efficiency, the body must contain the proper amount of all of the required elements. Normal nutrition and adequate elimination of waste enable the body to main-

tain a chemical balance.

VEGETABLE PIE WITH PEANUT BUTTER CRUST.

12 small white cooked onions

1 cup diced cooked celery

2 cups cooked peas

3 cooked carrots in small pieces

1 cup cooked string beans

3 tablespoons butter

5 tablespoons whole wheat flour

I teaspoon vegetized salt

1/2 teaspoon paprika

3 cups milk

Smoein seasoning

Make white sauce with butter, milk, flour and seasoning, add vegetables and pour into a large baking dish. Cover with peanut butter crust.

The Mystic Life of Christ

Scientific Digest



Steam Engine Run Without Fuel

A "solar motor," driving a tiny steam engine with no fuel but the sun's rays, was hailed recently by delegates to the third World Power Conference as the key to an almost unlimited treasure house of energy. Demonstrated for the first time, the sun machine was developed during a lifetime research by Dr. C. G. Abbot, secretary of the Smithsonian Institution.

It was examined with intense interest by Cabinet Ministers, scientists, and industrialists, among 3000 delegates from fifty-two nations, who opened their sessions with a blunt warning that the end of some other power resources, particularly petroleum, is already in sight.

Although Dr. Abbot's demonstration machine turned an engine of only one-half horsepower, he declared that the same principle could easily be used on a vast scale. If oil and coal supplies fail, he predicted, sun motors might light the world's homes and drive its factories.

For more than a century scientists have been trying to harness sunbeams, but Dr. Abbot's device is said to be the first to operate with an efficiency comparable to other motors.

The basic design of the solar heater was relatively simple. Three curved metal mirrors focused the sun's rays on glass tubes containing a black liquid of special chemical composition. Heated to 400 degrees Fahrenheit by the concentrated beams, the fluid passed through a boiler which generated enough steam to run the small engine.

Dr. Abbot foresaw special usefulness for his invention in arid regions, where sunshine would be "on tap" at virtually all seasons. Inexpensive sun motors might be used, he said, for pumping irrigation water, refrigeration, air conditioning, and cooking. His guests at the demonstration mentioned the possibility of giant installations in deserts, converting the sun's energy into electricity to serve distant cities.

Gano Dunn, president of the J. G. White Engineering Company, predicted that Dr. Abbot's machine "will enter the commercial field in a few years." Mr. Dunn said the device had been perfected to such a point that mirrors covering part of the surface of waters impounded by Hoover Dam "would develop power greater than the power given by the falling waters of the dam itself."

Experiments in Making Gold

PREAMS of making gold, envisaged by alchemists through the Ages, have come true. So stated Dr. L. W. Chubb, director of research laboratories of the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing Company.

"Economically, however, synthetic gold is not now feasible because it requires the use of platinum and other elements more costly than the gold itself," he explained. "It does not seem unreasonable, however, to expect, some time in the distant future, a practical method of transmuting elemental material and also making use of the enormous store of atomic energy."

Fascinating adaptation of physical and scientific facts to modern industrialism was described by the speaker. Specimens of tempered copper, which are
harder than the finest steel, and sheets
of transparent material, which not only
erase the glare of approaching automobile headlights but also eliminate the
very light itself, were exhibited at a recent meeting.

Grind equal parts of figs, dates, raisins and nuts in food chopper. Mix well with a small amount of honey and lemon juice. Form into a loaf and slice, or into balls and roll in cocoanut.

FRUIT NUT ROLL

One-half pound dried white figs, one-half pound dates, seeded, one-half pound seed raisins, walnuts or peanuts. Grind the above ingredients finely, add equal portions of walnuts or peanuts. Mix. Roll into loaf. Cover board with chopped or ground nuts, roll loaf in the nuts and cut in slices. A half pound of finely grated raw, tender carrots may be added to the mixture, if desired.

NUT CANDY

One cup shredded cocoanut, two teaspoonfuls lemon juice, four tablespoonfuls peanut butter. Mix thoroughly. Roll into balls and put in a cool place to harden.

Sift dry ingredients, work in peanut butter and add milk to make soft dough. Toss lightly on board and roll out to fit baking dish. Cut slits in dough to let steam escape and place over the vegetables. Dot top with tiny bits of butter and bake in a hot oven for about 20 minutes.

GLAZED APPLES AND SWEET POTATOES

3 tablespoons butter

11/2 cups sliced raw apples

1 cup sliced cooked sweet potatoes

4 tablespoons brown sugar 1 tablespoon lemon juice

1/4 cup water

1/2 teaspoon vegetized salt

Brown apples and potatoes in melted butter, add rest of ingredients, and cook slowly for 10 minutes.

DATE PUDDING.

3 eggs beaten separately

I cup brown sugar

I cup whole wheat bread crumbs

1/2 cup milk 1/3 cup flour

11/2 teaspoons baking powder

I teaspoon cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon cloves

1/3 teaspoon salt
1½ cups chopped dates
½ cup chopped nuts

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix all ingredients, folding in beaten egg whites last, and fill greased individual custard cups or small pans. Place in pan of hot water and bake 30 minutes in moderate oven. Serve hot or cold with whipped cream or spice sauce.

News from London

By C. RICHARD WRIGHT

Mr. Wright sends clippings from the London newspapers, and other reports of the Swami's lectures, as follows:

Swami Yogananda, founder-president of Yogoda Sat-Sanga Society (International Self-Realization Fellowship), with its Headquarters at Los Angeles, California, U. S. A., and Ranchi, India, returned to London after his extensive tour of India and the Continent of Europe.

During his stay in London, the Swami addressed two public meetings at Caxton Hall, Westminster, one on Sept. 22, and the other on Sept. 23. The subjects for the lectures were: "Removing Fatigue at Will" and "Highest Technique of God-Contact."

Kedarnath Das Gupta, founder and general secretary of the "World Fellowship of Fairhs," who knows intimately of the Swami's work in America, and is at present in London, presided at the meetings. In introducing the Swami, he said: "The Swami first went to the United States 17 years ago as the delegate from India to the International Congress of Religious Liberals in Boston. The Americans were much interested in the message of the Mystic from the East, and as a result the first Yogoda Sat-Sanga Center was established in Boston.

The Boston work grew rapidly and the Swami often had to go on lecture tours throughout the length and breadth of that sub-continent, addressing clubs, churches, societies, civic organizations, radio audiences, newspaper men, and universities on his system.

The number of Self-Realization Fellowship students in America now runs into 150,000. By its non-sectarian message and simple technique of practical methods, harmonizing muscular with organic growth, this Teaching will, in the words of the late Luther Burbank, well-known scientist, 'come as near to bringing the millennium as any system of human training in history.'

A reporter on a London daily newspaper, the Star, describing the meetings, said: "I managed to squeeze into Caxton Hall before the overflow invaded the Press table. Hall, floor, and balconies were crammed. For an hour and a quarter attention was held with reverence. I have heard few equals of the Swami as an orator. There was not a syllable of rant or unintelligible metaphysics. His character acting of a socially-distracted lady trying to practice meditation as the Swami

ordered, would have brought down any house. At the end of the 75 minutes, the Swami, apparently not the least bit fatigued, left the hall to address the overflow meeting in another hall."

On the second day, the large auditorium of Caxton Hall was equally overcrowded and another overflow meeting had to be held in another hall, which was also filled to capacity. The Swami illustrated his lecture subject with practical demonstrations and held both audiences spell-bound. The London Sunday Graphic described the meeting as follows: "In yesterday's demonstration, the Swami proved that he can stop his heart beating for a brief period; can stop his pulse at will, or lower his blood pressure; can control his sense of touch or eliminate it entirely, and can switch the energy on or off from any part of his body."

The British National Council of the World Fellowship of Faiths organized a meeting on Sept. 29th, at Whitefield's Congregational Church, where the Swami spoke on "How Faith in Fellowship may Save Civilization." The audience was highly appreciative of his message.

And still more clippings:

Swami Yogananda, metaphysician, poet, and world teacher, last night spoke at 8 p.m. to a very enthusiastic audience in Caxton Hall. The crowd was so great that part of it had to be transferred to the Windsor House Hall, which was also filled to capacity, and the Swami lectured there at 9:30 p.m. after finishing his lecture in Caxton Hall.

The lectures were preceded by a Tagore song and Rev. A. Porter of the Congregational Church spoke very highly of the practicality of Swami Yogananda's work, which had materially benefited him. Among other things he said: "I took Swami's teachings twelve years ago and in a short time I learned more than I received from the two Universities which I attended."

Then the Swami was introduced by the famous organizer and founder of the "World Fellowship of Faiths," Kedarnath Das Gupta, in the following words:

"No other Oriental lecturer has ever before filled two halls, and spoken in two places, on the same night, in London. I must go to Windsor House to keep the people rogether until the Swami finishes his lecture here to you in Caxton Hall and then goes there to lecture. I now have the pleasure to introduce to you the great teacher from India, Swami Yoga-

Amidst cheers and applause, the Swami came and delivered his lecture, which was very much appreciated by the large and distinguished audience, and ended in continuous applause and cheers until the Swami retired."

More excerpts from newspapers. One re-

porter said:

"Paramount's newsreel lads were busy with Swami Yogananda when I called Grosvenor House to inquire into the Yoga way to health and happiness. Swami Yogananda, with long black hair over his shoulders, lit up the room with his courteous smile and impressive dignity. He said: "I like the definiteness of the Western people. I have taken that from the West. Spirituality does not mean living in the clouds. Just as the Western people use physical mechanisms to make physical happiness, so the genuine Yogi Masters of India teach how to use mental mechanisms with a technique of concentration and meditation, in order to insure lasting happiness during all the ups and downs of life."

Mr. Wright adds: The classes grew so large we were obliged to seek larger accommodations, which surprised everyone, optimists and pessimists alike, for the lecture season

was not in sway at the time.




