

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The Ancient Hindu Ideal of Kingship

The divine sage Narada once visited Yudhisthira when the latter was holding his royal court at Indraprastha.

Yudhisthira received the sage with all honor due him, and after the usual exchange of greetings, the divine sage asked the king: "O royal friend, tell me, can you devote your mind to spiritual thoughts while engaged in pursuits of the world?

"Shall I take it that you have not made your mind impure by too much attachment to sense-enjoyments, that you do not forget your traditional nobility while engaged in the pursuit of dharma, artha and harma (religious and social duties, material possessions and fulfillment of desires) and that you are not indifferent to the performance of your religious duties? Have you subdued your sleep? Do you wake up at the right time? Do you think out daily

in the latter part of the night what is right and what is wrong?

"Do the farmers behave rightly in your absence? For that is a sign of their true love for their king. Are all your servants faithful, contented and serving you in line from father to son? Do you appoint the knowers of *dharma* and men with expert knowledge to examine every state project before it is launched? Do you appoint veteran warriors to train the princes and youths in the art of war?

Men of High Character

"Have you appointed, with all due respects, a man of high character and birth, a learned and generous man untouched by malice, to act as your priest? Have you appointed sincere men of character with pure and noble heredity as your ministers, assigning to them different portfolios?

"Shall I trust you do not exasperate your subjects by inflicting

heavy punishments on them? Do the ministers administer the country according to your orders? Are the chief warriors of your army skillful in every kind of warfare and strong and mighty and courageous men of character and duly honored by you? Do you pay your soldiers adequate salaries and provide them with provisions at the proper time?

"I should like to be assured that you have not transferred all power of the war office to a single man who can act arbitrarily. For a man possessing such arbitrary powers will be surely tempted to exceed the limits of his authority. honor the man who uses his talents in doing your work in a perfect manner and give him proper salary and provisions? Do you honor all men of knowledge, learning, talents and character by offering gifts of money to them? Do you provide for the maintenance of the families of those who may lose their lives or get otherwise disabled while rendering faithful service to you?

"Do you protect as your son the weak and vanquished, and the terror-stricken enemy, who seeks refuge in you? Do you regard the
whole world with an equal eye even
as parents equally love all their
children? Do you befriend and
patronize all aged people, people of
your caste, men who stand as teachers in relation to you, traders,
craftsmen, men dependent on you
for their living, the destitute and
the forlorn, and provide them with
food and money? Do you take

care of your expert, cautious and well-meaning servants and not remove them from their office unless they are found guilty of any gross offense?

Men Best Fitted

"Do you take care that every state appointment is filled by a man best fitted for it by his ability and standard of efficiency? Do you understand that no appointments should be given to greedy, corrupt, hateful and untried men? Are you sure that your subjects do not suffer from any molestation from thieves and robbers, greedy men, ignorant youths, or from any tyranny on your part?

"Are the farmers of the state living a life of peace and contentment? Have you provided for a plentiful supply of water by getting big tanks dug in various places of your state? Have you arranged that cultivation may not depend solely on rains? Do your farmers possess sufficient stocks of seeds and corn and never run short of them? Do you give them loans when necessary?

"Are you satisfied that gangs of thieves and robbers do not infest your kingdom carrying on nefarious works of loot and plunder? Are the women contented and safe in your state? Do you observe the practice of sleeping in the early hours of the night and getting up early in order to devote your mind to contemplation?

"Do you remove bodily ailments by means of medicine and proper diet, and mental diseases by serving the aged? Shall I believe that you are not led away by any feeling of greed, attachment or pride while attending to the depositions of plaintiffs and defendants? Do you guard yourself against the error of depriving any of your dependents of his appointment out of greed, attachment, mistrust or misguided love?

"Shall I take it you do not unnecessarily harass a weak enemy? Shall I understand that you do not use your power in utterly ruining anybody? Do you respect and honor the Brahmans and other men of virtues according to their merits? Do you zcalously follow the Vedic Dharma (religion) acted up to by your ancestors? Do you perform the various sacrifices in their right manner with your mind wholly subdued and concentrated on them? Do you bow before your teachers, the elders of the race, the gods, performers of penance, the Chaitya tree and Brahmans devoted to benevolence?

"O sinless one, shall I believe that you are never overwhelmed by grief or anger? Are you sure that no true and innocent man, falsely assused of theft by any ignorant officers, is ever sentenced to death? Are your officers dutiful enough not to fall a victim to any temptation of bribe and let off the thief, the wicked, the evil-designer, the untruthful and the punishable after he is caught red-handed? Are your ministers so scrupulous as not to be carried away by any lust of money and to unjustly decide in favor of the rich against the poor?

"Have you entirely relinquished defects like unbelief in God, untruth, anger, wrongdoing, lethargy, avoiding men of knowledge, sloth, fickleness of mind, constantly worrying about money? Are merchants respected in your city and kingdom and are they allowed to bring commodities for sale only after examination by your officers? Do you hear daily the religious discourses of aged men of religious and spiritual knowledge and experience?

"Do you always remember whatever good anybody does to you? Do you praise and publicly honor and offer presents to one who does some noble act? Do you protect your state from the dangers of fire and from wicked men of demoniac ways? Have you entirely given up the six evils of sleep, sloth, fear, anger, excessive mildness and dilatoriness?"

Given Great Lesson

King Yudhisthira listened to these questions with utmost attention and when the divine sage finished, said, "My lord, you have given me a very definite lesson on dharma, (duty), which is just as it should be. I have always tried to do to the best of my ability what kings ought to do, and what all kings of the past did with their justly earned wealth."

We find an interesting episode about king Aswapati in the fifth chapter of the Chhandogya Upanisad. Once upon a time there came to him some sages, to learn from him the Vaiswanara Vidya, a special branch of spiritual knowledge.

The king received them all with due respects and thinking within himself that their object in coming to him might be to get some money, he offered them a very large amount. But the sages went there with a different purpose. So they refused to accept the money.

The king thought the sages might have suspected some impurity in the money offered to them and at once proceeded to establish the purity of his wealth.

Ancient Righteousness

He said, "O sages, in my kingdom there is no thief, no miser, no drunkard, no man without the fire of worship, none without the knowledge of the truth, none who is a debauchee, and no woman of unchaste character."

Is there any king nowadays who can claim such purity for his kingdom?

The happiness and prosperity which prevailed in the ancient kngdom of Sri Rama is proverbial. The very word *Rama-Rajya* has come to be a synonym for an ideal Goswami Tulasidasji describes it beautifully in his Ramacharitamanasa. He says: "The moment Sri Rama ascended the royal throne, all the three worlds were freed from grief. There was no hatred throughout his kingdom, all differences had disappeared with the rising influence of Sri Rama. All men followed their respective They had nothing to iear, nothing to grieve, nothing to suffer from. The three kinds of suffering, physical, mental and cosmic, were unknown in the kingdom of Sri Rama.

"All men loved each other and faithfully and willingly followed the Vedic path, discharging their respective duties according to the injunctions of the Vedas. Dharma with all its four aspects, truth, purity, kindness and charity reigned supreme in the world. There was no sin even in a dream. All men and women were wholly devoted to Sri Rama and all were competent to reach the highest state of liberation.

"There was neither premature death, nor any kind of suffering. All were physically well-built and healthy, none poor, destitute or wretched. There was none who was dull, ignorant or devoid of All were frank, good qualities. dutiful and righteous. All men and women were skillful and virtuous. They appreciated the good qualities in others and were learned scholars and wise. They knew how to be grateful, deceit and trickery being alien to their nature. During his rule the whole world of spirit and matter was entirely free from those sufferings which brought about by time, action, nature and its qualities.

Men Were Monogamists

"All men and women were generous, always doing good to others and all were devoted to the service of *Brahmans*. All men, without exception, were monogamists. Similarly, women were devoted to their husbands in thought, word and deed. Trees in the woods bore

flowers and fruits during all seasons of the year. The elephant and the lion forgot their mutual antagonism and lived peacefully together. All birds and animals shed their natural antipathy and promoted mutual love.

"The air was cool and blew gently, spreading the sweetest fragrance. The creepers and trees dropped honey for the mere asking, the cows gave milk copiously and the earth produced crops plentifully throughout the year. The sea waves brought pearls and gems to the shore which were picked up by men at pleasure. The sun heated the earth only to the extent of its need and the clouds poured rain always in proportion to the needs of different places and times."

In Jaimini-Aswamedha we read the story of the great devotee Sudhanwa, where it is stated that in the kingdom of Hamsadhwaja, the father of Sudhanwa, all men were monogamists and all men and women were great devotees of the Lord. Anybody who came from outside and sought employment in the kingdom of Hamsadhwaja was definitely told by the king that if he was an avowed monogamist, he could get an appointment; for, the king used to say, he was no admirer of meaningless bravery, high birth or valor; he could appoint, whether in his household or in the services of the state, only one who was devoted to his only wife and was a true devotee of the Lord. In the opinion of the king a mighty warrior was he, who could keep the urge of sex under control.

The royal army consisted of soldiers who were all devotees of God, valiant fighters, kind and generous to the poor and helpless, avowed monogamists, possessed of self-control and gifted with sweet speech. The king himself was an avowed monogamist and as such he could influence his subjects to observe the rule.

Ideal of Sacrifice

Following the ancient Hindu ideal of kingship, King Hamasadhwaja sentenced his son Sudhanwa to death for not having presented himself in time on the battlefield, King Sibi offered his own body to the pigeon which had protect sought shelter under him, King Harischandra gave up his whole kingdom for the sake of truth, and King Rantideva offered to his guest the only food and water he could procure after a continuous fast of forty-eight days. By virtue of these ideal lives of sacrifice lived by them, the kings of old were enabled to establish dharma (righteousness) in This was the reason the world. why their subjects followed their kings in the practice of dharma and peace and happiness reigned supreme everywhere in the world. May we hope that the kings of today will be willing to follow this ancient ideal and spread peace and happiness to all corners of the world?-Kalyana-Kalpataru.

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





Spiritual Interpretation * BHAGAVAD GITA

True Happiness Only Found by Overcoming the Limitations of the Ego.

Chapter II, Stanza 71

Literal Translation:

That person who relinquishes all desires, devoid of cravings, without identification with the mortal ego and its sense of "mine-ness," experiences peace.

Poetic Rendition:

A soul who roams on earth, free from driving desires, and from the invasion of new cravings, and who is not a slave to the ego and its mean sense of "mine-ness," can be a pied piper of peace.

Spiritual Interpretation:

This stanza of Bhagavad Gita gives a recipe of peace according to the one-sided school of renunciation. Hence it is useful chiefly to complete renunciates and monks who are free from worldly duties. A recluse who runs away from the desires of worldly possession, and of bodily cares, and who keeps the soil of mind ablaze with wisdom so that no seeds of new objects could ever sprout into new desires, and whose soul is not identified with the human ego and its confining, limiting, and reincarnation-making, pain-producing desires for temporary earthly possessions, can enjoy peace.

It must be understood that peace is the first product of freedom from all good and bad desires. To the recluse even desires for health and prosperity, considered good in gen-

eral by people, are looked upon as a producer of evil. All desires born of the bodily contact produce endless roamings in the corridors of earthly incarnations, because one desire leads to another.

When a person dies without uprooting all desires he is chained to the earthly life. Hence the renunciate not only forsakes evil desires which deeply entangle the soul in the insatiable weavings of lust for sense objects, but he does away also with all good desires, as these enmesh one in earthly longings.

Eternal Vigil

The renunciate thus relinquishes all desires, as they spread like cancer roots which ultimately strangle the wisdom and peace of the soul. The renunciate also watches and keeps an eternal vigil, ever keeping the fire of his wisdom burning so that no seeds of earthly desires can germinate on the soil of his mind.

The renunciate is not content with abandoning past desires, but he prevents the weeds of new desires from growing.

The renunciate also learns to separate his soul from his ego and its mortal lusts.

Every devotee, free from the consciousness of the body by meditation, who can disconnect his mind at will from the body, realizes the difference between the pure soul made in the image of God, and the soul in bondage to the body and its habits and longings, known as the "ego".

A king slept on a bed of gold in a golden castle and dreamed he was a beggar. Under the delusion of the dream state he cried, "Please give me a penny—please give me a penny—I am a hungry beggar."

The queen, sleeping by his side, woke up at the dreaming king's cries. When she heard the king crying again and again for a penny she shook him and he woke up, free from his dream delusions.

Likewise the kingly soul, a perfect image of the omnipresent, all-powerful Spirit, is sleeping in ignorance and dreaming it is a poor mortal with all the afflictions and limitations of a human brain and its habits of thought. When by meditation this false body consciousness or ego consciousness disappears, the soul realizes its own status as the prince-son of the King of the Universe.

That is why the renunciate and the wise man do not identify their pure perfect soul—the image of God—with the mortal ego and its reincarnation-making desires. The soul, free from the ego and earthly limitations and its desires to remain carthbound from earthly longings, inherits the everlasting peace in the soul, which is its birthright, being born from pure perfect Spirit.

Cause of Reincarnation

Reincarnation is caused by the desire of the misguided soul or ego to roam constantly in the trouble-making slums of the earth, for-saking the heavenly mansion of Infinitude where perpetual ever-new felicity reigns.

The above philosophy is applicable to the life of the renunciate and the man of wisdom who has practically burnt up all his roots of past desires of this and past incarnations.

But to the modern business man who wants to perform worldly duties as well as find God, the Bhagavad Gita counsels elsewhere: "He is not a Yogi or a renunciate or one who is united to God who renounces action."

A man who renounces the fruits of action, and acts only for God, is a man of renunciation as well as a Yogi. He is a man of renunciation who relinquishes the desire to be the sole beneficiary of the results of his actions, and he is a Yogi and united to God who works only to please Him and not to satisfy the lusts of the sense-enslaved ego.

Every business man can look after his health duties and family duties as parts assigned to him by his Cosmic Director to be played on the stage of the earth. Such a business man is a renunciate, for he does his duties and plays his earthly parts by relinquishing his own desire to do them. He says, "I did not create a body or family or the world. So why should I create attachments for them? I perform my worldly duties because God put them upon me. I perform all duties to please Him." Such a business man is also a Yogi, for he is ever united to God, acting always for Him.

By the above way of being in the world but not of the world one can obtain peace. It is difficult to do so, but it can be accomplished by an iron will. The path of renunciation, escape from the earthly scenes of trouble, relinquishing longings from within, may be easier in producing peace. But it must be remembered it is easy to run away from outward objects of desires and the jungle of mundane civilization, but it is most difficult to flee from the jungle of internal desires infested with the wild beasts of passions which pursue one everywhere.

Free From Internal Desires

The Yogi business man must free himself from internal desires which cause real bondage even though he lives in the outward jungle of materiality. The man of renunciation must outwardly and inwardly free himself from the jungle of material objects and of inner longings. Then and then only, whether in the world or in the seclusion of a woodland, whether a business man or a renunciate, one can attain peace.

Whether we are working in the world or as renunciates in a forest, our one object should be to recover the lost peace of the soul which is made in the true image of everblessed Spirit.

Tagore—World Citizen

Rabindranath Tagore, India's famous poet and Nobel prizeman in Literature, recently passed away at the ripe old age of eighty. The editor of *The Scholar* (India) paid Tagore the following tribute:

In this mad world of ours, it has been given only to a very few to be loved and mourned by all. Tagore was one such. In his death, India lost one of her greatest sons who shed luster on her name and the world, one of her foremost Poet, artist, philosopher citizens. and humanitarian, he belonged to all the world, and his will be an honored name in a sensible history of the world—a history, in other words, of the adventures and growth of the human mind and not the sickening story of the quarrels and follies of a few kings and warriors.

Rabindranath Tagore was born in Calcutta on May 7, 1861, to a famous father who sang:

O Spiritual Guide of the universe, Thou art without form:

Yet that I have conceived Thine image in the act of meditation;

That I have ignored Thine inexpressibility by words of praise:

That I have set at naught Thy omnipresence by making pilgrimages and in other ways—

For these three transgressions committed through confusion of spirit,

O Almighty God, I implore Thy forgiveness.

Art, in its varied forms, had been a gift of the family for generations

and Rabindranath's brothers were talented artists. In their blossomed the genius that was to spread its perfume the world over. His grandfather was known as Prince Dwaraknath, for his wealth, and thus Rabindranath was free from the menace of poverty which has been the bane of many a genius in India. The heat of poverty has dried up many springs of genius and the proverbial wolf at the door has blocked all the secret doors of the mind. "Give us, O Lord, our daily bread" is a cry that rings across their whole career, and life's canvas, for them, is filled with the sole adventure of breadwinning.

But Tagore was free. To borrow his own phrase, the voice of the Angel of Leisure rose above the din of the clamor and scramble, saying "Rejoice". And rejoice he did. He created beauty as few others did. His poems and songs which are on the lips of every Bengali peasant, are the spontaneous outpouring of a happy mind, filled with the joy of life.

The conquests of Tagore's muse constitute a far-flung empire, sprawling across many a region of disputed sovereignty. Science, art, religion, mysticism are all there, but philosophy, taking its stand on the totality of human experience, sets the pattern of government. To any discerning student, the most striking

feature of Tagore's works will be his synthetic vision which weaves poetry, art, science and religion into an exquisite fabric. His works bring to us a fresh breeze from realms in which the Indian mind roamed thousands of years ago to produce its unexcelled travellogues—the *Upanishads*. They recapture to us the spirit of the rishis (wise men) whose vision, more penetrative than X-rays, delved into the heart of things.

Tagore's works are at once a crosssection of modern Indian thought and a glorious continuation and amplification of ancient Indian culture. And in his protest against the menace of mechanization, he represents India's reaction to the technological civilization which has now drawn us to the edge of a precipice.

We have studiedly avoided particular reference to any of his works, for it is not possible to single out any one of them as the best. But, having set out the father's prayer as the background, we cannot but draw attention to one sublime thought of the son which pervades all his works and actions with a strange power:

Life of my life, I shall ever try to keep my body pure, knowing that Thou art truth which has kindled the light of reason in my mind;

I shall ever try to drive all evils away from my heart, knowing that Thou hast Thy seat in the inmost shrine of my heart;

And it shall be my endeavor to reveal Thee in my actions, knowing it is. Thy power gives me strength to act.

THE SAYINGS OF MUHAMMAD

(By Allama Sir Abdullah al-Mamun al-Suhrawardy, "Wisdom of the East" Series. E. P. Dutton & Co., New York. \$1.50.)

This little book comprises 439 translated sayings of the prophet. The Introduction gives a summary of Muhammad's life and mission which will do much to remove misconceptions about Islam in the Western mind. There is also a Foreword by Mahatma Gandhi.

It is said that the great Russian novelist Tolstoy constantly carried with him a copy of the first edition of this little work. A few of Muhammad's words of wisdom are given here:

- 1. Actions will be judged according to intentions.
 - 2. The proof of a Muslim's sin-

cerity is that he payeth no heed to that which is not his business.

- 3. No man is a true believer unless he desireth for his brother that which he desireth for himself.
- 4.* That which is lawful is clear, and that which is unlawful likewise, but there are certain doubtful things between the two from which it is well to abstain.

There are two benefits, of which the generality of men are losers, and of which they do not know the value—health and leisure.

Charity that is concealed appeaseth the wrath of God.

Your smiling in your brother's face, is charity; and your exhorting mankind to virtuous deeds, is

charity; and your prohibiting the forbidden, is charity; and your showing men the road, in the land in which they lose it, is charity; and your assisting the blind, is charity.

The exercise of religious duties will not atone for the fault of an abusive tongue.

"Give me advice," said someone. Muhammad said, "Be not angry."

No person hath drunk a better draught than that of anger which he hath swallowed for God's sake.

Abuse nobody, and if a man abuse thee, and lay open a vice which he knoweth in thee, then do not disclose one which thou knowest in him.

Ye will not enter Paradise until ye have faith, and ye will not complete your faith until ye love one another.

In prayers, all thoughts must be laid aside, but those of God; in conversation, no word is to be uttered which may afterwards be repented of; do not covet from others, or have any hopes from them.

My Lord hath commanded me nine things: (1) To reverence Him, externally and internally; (2) to speak the truth, and with propriety, in prosperity and adversity; (3) moderation in affluence and poverty; (4) to benefit my relations and kindred, who do not benefit me; (5) to give alms to him who refuseth me; (6) to forgive him who injureth me; (7) that my silence should be in at-

taining a knowledge of God; (8) that when I speak, I should mention I lim; (9) that when I look on God's creatures, it should be as an example for them.

It is not a sixth or a tenth of a man's devotion which is acceptable to God, but only such portions thereof as he offereth with understanding and true devotional spirit.


TRUE KNOWLEDGE

Second Coming of Christ

Steps Toward the Attaining of the Consciousness Which was in Christ Jesus

Meaning of "When Thy Eye Be Single, Thy Whole Body Shall be Full of Light."

No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light.

The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness. Take heed therefore, that the light which is in thee he not darkness.

If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a can-

dle doth give thee light.—Luke 11: 33-36.

"No true devotee likes to perform miracles or display his divine powers as a challenge to disbelievers. But when a devotee has lighted the candle of wisdom within him he doesn't put it in a secret place of his mind nor hide it under the bushel of indifference. He sets it on the candlestick of open and sincere living, that truth seekers may see and profit by the light of his wisdom.

"The God-revealing light in the body is the spiritual eye in the middle of the forchead, as seen by devotees when their eyes are closed in meditation. When the devotee with half-closed eyes focuses his vision at the point between the eyebrows the two lights of the two eyes become one and single, visible as the single spiritual eye, the divine telescope with which the kingdom of God can be visioned. When the devotee can perceive through this spiritual eye, his whole body as well as his cosmic body becomes filled with the light emanating from cosmic vibration.

"But when a man's gaze and mind become concentrated on evil motives and actions, his life is filled with the darkness of ignorance and misery-making habits.

Filled with Astral Light

"Therefore, take care that the cosmic light and wisdom which are in you do not remain hidden behind the darkness of ignorance, spiritual indifference and non-meditating habits. If your whole body is filled with astral light and wisdom, all physical and mental darkness will be gone and the whole cosmos will be seen as filled with cosmic light, cosmic wisdom and joy. Just as a brightly shining candle gives light, so when this light of Self-realization will be fully manifest in you, you will receive indescribable joy and the unending guidance of divine wisdom."

And as he spake, a certain Pharisee besought him to dine with him: and he went in, and sat down to meat.

And when the Pharisee saw it.

he marvelled that he had not first washed before dinner.

And the Lord said unto him, Now do ye Pharisees make clean the outside of the cup and the platter; but your inward part is full of ravening and wickedness.

Ye fools, did not he that made that which is without make that which is within also?

But rather give alms of such things as ye have; and, behold, all things are clean unto you.

But woe unto you. Pharisees! for ye tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass over judgment and the love of God: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.

Woe unto you, Pharisees! for ye love the uppermost seats in the synagogues, and greetings in the markets.

Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are as graves which appear not, and the men that walk over them are not aware of them.—Luke 11: 37-44.

"O ye hypocrites, you are used to display the physical cleanliness of your outer cup of life, but you neglect to clean your inner life which is filled with ravening and wickedness and evil thoughts. You are foolish not to know that God made both the outside and inside of the cup of your life. You should keep your outer life clean by good actions and your inner life clean by good thoughts and meditation. Your body, mind and soul, being made after the perfect image of God,

must be kept uniformly perfect, by inner and outer discipline.

"You must not so concentrate on the outer discipline that you forget to cleanse your inner life. cleaning your inner and outer life with wisdom and meditation, give alms or share your spiritual life You will then find with others. that the whole cosmos is filled with purity. Be pure and make others But O ye hypocrites, you will reap many miseries due to your own evil actions. You prefer to tithe your people with money and spices but forget to teach them the law of karma or the law of cause and effect which divinely judges the actions of all men. You forget to teach them how they can purify their inward life by feeling the love of God in meditation. You ought first to have cleaned your inner life, at the same time not neglecting the cleansing of your outer life.

Shun Outer Praise

"O ye Pharisees, you will attract misery unto yourselves through your love of man's recognition and not God's recognition. By your desire for human praise you keep your outer life hypocritically disciplined, thus forgetting to pay attention to the spiritualization of your inner life. By forgetting to cultivate the joys of eternal life you attract unto yourself much misery. Ignorantly you love the uppermost seats in the synagogues and the greetings of the people in the markets who feed your vanity, thus increasing your ignorance and aggravating your misery.

"Because of your hypocritical action of being outwardly holy for effect, you will attract much misery through the deepening of your ignorance. As the outward surface of a grave usually looks nice while its inside is filled with a hideous corpse, so, by your veneer of outward holiness you look like beautiful graves while your inside is filled with decaying life and rotting wisdom. People see your outside beauty and forget your inward ugliness."

Then answered one of the lawyers, and said unto him, Master, thus saying thou reproachest us also.

And he said, Woe unto you also, ye lawyers! for ye lade men with burdens grievous to be borne, and ye yourselves touch not the burdens with one of your fingers.

Woe unto you! for ye build the sepulchres of the prophets, and

our fathers killed them.

Truly ye bear witness that ye allow the deeds of your fathers: for they indeed killed them, and ye build their sepulchres.

Therefore also said the wisdom of God, I will send them prophets and apostles, and some of them they shall slay and persecute:

That the blood of all the prophets, which was shed from the foundation of the world, may be re-

quired of this generation;

From the blood of Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, which perished between the altar and the temple: verily I say unto you, It shall be required of this generation.

Woe unto you, lawyers! for ye have taken away the key of knowl-

edge: ye entered not in yourselves, and them that were entering in ye hindered.

And as he said these things unto them, the scribes and the Pharisees began to urge him vehemently, and to provoke him to speak of many things:

Laying wait for him, and seeking to catch something out of his mouth, that they might accuse him.

—Luke 11: 45.54.

"According to the law of karma the wickedness born from shedding the blood of prophets since the foundation of the world vibrates upon this wicked generation, causing them various miseries. The sins accruing from the blood of Abel and of Zacharias which perished before the altar of the temple, and of slain prophets vibrating in the ether, will cause many miseries to this generation."

Etheric Vibrations

A very prominent honest lawyer of modern times said to his client: "If you want to keep out of trouble, keep away from lawsuits, and law courts, and lawyers, and from me. too, who is a lawyer." wicked lawyers for mercenary gain have obscured truth by their clever arguments and freed criminals while sending the innocent to ruin or Many wicked lawyers have fought against truth and have been the cause of suffering to good men. Many wicked people have murdered prophets and saints. The evil effects (karma) resulting from the sins of murderers who go unpun-

ished vibrate in the ether through generations, causing famines, fires, epidemics, pestilence, earthquakes, wars, bloody feuds and strifes, debauchery and wickedness. Just as disease germs spread by an unhygienic clan may persist and remain in a community even after the clansmen migrate away, so the bacteria of sinful vibrating thoughts and tendencies created by the people of one generation in a place persist and continue in the next or many later generations. All the different modern races of people of the earth are composed of the good and evil vibrations of all their forefathers since the earth began.

As an individual is responsible for all the seeds of actions of his past lives, subtly stored up in his subconscious mind and brain, so every individual race is responsible for the past actions of its fathers and forefathers subtly accumulated in the subconscious mind of that race. This is what makes racial differences—the Americans, utilitarians; Hindus, spiritual seekers; the English, colonists; the French, liberals; and so forth.

The Hindus love peace because their forefathers loved peace, and some of the Western nations want to fight because of their warlike ancestry. Every generation suffers or prospers more or less according to some of the past actions of its forefathers. In the meantime, when there were gathered together an innumerable multitude of people, insomuch that they trode one upon another, he began to say unto his disciples first of all, Beware ye of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy.

For there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; neither hid.

that shall not be known.

Therefore, whatsoever ye have spoken in darkness shall be heard in the light; and that which ye have spoken in the ear in closets shall be proclaimed upon the house-tops.—Luke 12: 1-3.

"As fermentation spoils milk, so the Pharisees use hypocrisy to ferment and destroy their minds and souls. As the leaven secretly works in the bread, so hypocrisy secretly inflates the ego. No matter how people, like Pharisees, keep wickedness hidden beneath the mask of hypocritical goodness, still all hidden wickedness like fire will burn the veil which hides it and makes itself manifest to the world.

All Will Be Known

"Nothing can be hidden which will not be known. All good and bad things are ultimately revealed. Even all wicked thoughts which people think and speak within themselves in the dark secrecy and privacy of their minds vibrate in the ether and are registered there.

"God, who is omnipresent and omniscient, knows all good and bad things which quietly come and go in the secrecy of human minds. Through the law of vibration, all secrets spoken or whispered in closets may be known in public some time or other. In reality there are no secrets in the world, for even when a man dies with certain secrets in his soul, they are openly read by God who has countless eyes in ether and all space. God, being the Mind of all minds and the Life of all the cosmos, knows everything which arises and dies in human minds and all things which happen in nature and every speck of cosmic space."

And I say unto you, my friends. Be not afraid of them that kill the body, and after that have no more that they can do.

But I will forewarn you whom ye shall fear: Fear him, which after he hath killed hath power to cast into hell; yea, I say unto you, Fear him.

Are not five sparrows sold for two farthings, and not one of them is forgotten before God?

But even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. Fear not therefore: ye are of more value than many sparrows.—Luke 12: 4-7.

"I vehemently declare unto you, my friends, (friends elected through the choice of my Father's love in my heart and not imposed upon me as relatives by nature) do not be afraid of those that threaten to kill your body, for even if they can do so, they cannot kill or cause grief to your mind or soul. But I will warn all those that are wicked, that you must learn to respect and love God who has the power, even

after the death of your bodies, to make your souls conscious and consciously to make them suffer all their accumulated wickedness of one life or many lives. Therefore, learn more to fear your own wicked actions which can compel the divine law to make you conscious of your evil actions and tendencies even in the after-death state. You must fear to disobey the divine law which can make you conscious of your selfcreated after-death burning conscience | and wicked tendencies (hell).

When you will know Him, you will understand the why of all inexplicable circumstances and happenings and you will marvel at the wisdom of the Father which guides everything and tries to foil the inharmonious actions of Satan and Cosmic Delusion. You, being made in the image of God and much more valuable than sparrows, must not be afraid of divine negligence but must be sure that He will help you to retrace your footsteps to His Kingdom of Eeternal Bliss, if you make the effort to know Him by deep meditation."

By the above words, it must be realized that though fire and sword can hurt the body, ignorance hurts

the soul after it passes out of the body. The conception of hell as a place where souls are burned with fire and smoke is ridiculous. Material fire can produce sensations of burning on the physical body only. In the after-death state, the soul is disembodied and can not be conscious of physical sensations. the soul could be conscious of hellish wicked tendencies acquired in the earth life. These wicked tendencies can create a self-created mental hell or torture which can be worse than a physical fiery hell.

A fiery hell can torture the body only for a little while, for the unconsciousness of death shuts out all physical sensations. But the mental hell of wickedness can persist in the soul in the after-death state indefinitely unless the individual soul repents and prays for release. Each soul by its stubbornness and docgedness to be wicked even in the after-death state may make this mental hell everlasting as he desires. This is what is meant by everlasting hell-fire. In earthly life also one can create a mental hell.

Also I say unto you, Whosoever shall confess me before men, him shall the Son of man also confess before the angels of God. But he that denieth me before men shall be denied before the angels of God.

And whosoever shall speak a word against the Son of man, it shall be forgiven him: but unto him that blasphemeth against the Holy Ghost it shall not be forgiven.

And when they bring you into the synagogues, and unto magis-

trates, and powers, take ye no thought how or what thing ye shall answer, or what ye shall say: For the Holy Ghost shall teach you in the same hour what ye ought to say.—Luke 12: 8-12.

"The intelligent Cosmic Vibration, the physical manifestation of God, will drop the specific needed wisdom within your developed intuition at the time you are required to speak something in defense of truth and yourself, living for its cause."

In the above passages, Jesus tells advanced devotees to use the Cosmic Vibration and its wisdom, and not the ego with its limitations, for general guidance of conduct in critical moments. Most people speak, guided only by their selfishness, fear and limited ego. Hence the outcome of their speech often becomes disastrous to them. vanced souls find it wise to guide their intelligence and free will and speech by the divine wisdom in the Holy Ghost (OM). All true devotees who have felt this Cosmic Sound or Holy Ghost in meditation can fruitfully guide their intuition and speech in all problems of life, according to the direction of infinite wisdom.

And one of the company said unto him, Master, speak to my brother, that he divide the inheritance with me. And he said unto him, Man. who made me a judge or a divider over you?— Luke 12: 13-14.

"Materially minded man, God and your karma should be the judge to divide the inheritance in question."

In the above, Jesus signifies that he was principally interested in spiritual matters, therefore, he did not want to bother about the division of properties.

And he said unto them, Take beed, and beware of covetousness: for a man's life consisteth not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth.—Luke 12: 15.

It is quite usual for people who possess too many things to be unhappy, for their time is spent in worrying about their possessions and not in enjoying what they have. Jesus also points out that those persons who think their lives are secure because of possessions are greatly mistaken. He goes on to illustrate that point by the following parable:

And he spake a parable unto them, saying, The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plentifully: And he thought within himself, saying, What shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? And he said, This will I do: I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry.

But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall

those things be, which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.—Luke 12: 16-21.

In the above words, Jesus speaks of the false security which covetousness for material possessions imparts to the soul. Many men work so hard in the world for material things, and accumulate vast sums of money, only to die when they are about to enjoy them. Such events distinctly show how foolish it is to spend all one's time in making money for the fleeting body which which can die at any moment.

It is better for every person to acquire the riches of lasting bliss of daily meditation, wisdom and divine qualities by serving others. Hard-earned material riches have to be forsaken without notice at the call of death, but all spiritual qualities acquired by meditation, self-denial and self-discipline are lasting treasures of the soul which accompany it to eternity when the body ceases to exist.

Material riches temporarily bring admiration from worldly people, but they are useless at death. Spiritual riches acquired by anyone may not attract admiration of worldly people but they are very useful to the soul in the after-death state. Spiritual riches ensure eternal freedom and the security of lasting happiness to the soul. Therefore, Jesus says, human beings should try their utmost to use the short precious time of life to acquire the harvest of immortality and not disillusionment.

Money and riches do not ensure freedom from sickness or death or accidents or mental sorrows, but the divine bliss acquired in meditation gives unchangeable happiness to the soul in moments of great trials and tribulations and also at the time of death. Jesus in his life demonstrated that. He gave up all material comforts and even the comforts of his flesh to become free and virtuous before the eyes of God.

SCIENTIFIC DIGEST

CHEMIST'S UTOPIA

More scientific knowledge and better control of the soil, new varictics of crops with greater yields and finer quality, elimination of the guessing in agriculture, controlled feeding and exercise of domestic animals, automobiles with plastic bodies, medicine which is largely preventive, houses and factories without windows, wireless communication which will enable us to talk to anybody at any time—these are the probabilities of the future as Dr. Francis J. Curtis, Monsanto chemist, presents in a dream paper which he has prepared for the American Chemical Society.

Dr. Curtis measures civilization in terms of the control that man exercises over his environment. "As some super-ape first picked up a stone, threw it at an animal to kill it and thereby achieved more than he could do with his bare hands, so at some future date some scientist will tie up the last variable and control will be complete," is his optimistic way of putting it.

The farmer today sows a seed about which he knows nothing, in a soil of unknown properties, trusts to luck that it will not be injured or destroyed by rain or drought, and competes for the preservation of his products with a host of insects, fungi and animals with no sense of property rights. Dr. Cur-

tis holds that the farmer of the future will know the requirements of every type of seed, something about the hormones and soil constituents, and probably other things that we have never heard of which are necessary to grow fine crops. If he is right we shall no longer look at a piece of ground and judge it by its color and the consistency of its soil.

Sees New Plant Varieties

He even conceives new varieties of plants with greater yield and the fixation of factors of taste, ripening, quality and quantity. Agriculture will gradually pass into the factory stage where there will be no guessing and no fourteen-hour day. The science of hydroponics (the culture of plants in water) is a clue to progress in the right direction.

Though breeding has improved animal strains, more remains to be done. Dr. Curtis predicts that much of the knowledge gained to improve human health will be applied to animals. They also need hormones and vitamins.

Dr. Curtis foresees the control of the necessary constituents of foods through the same process, adding those which are needed, replacing those removed. Under war conditions in England vitamin B₁ and calcium are added to flour by government decree. To Dr. Curtis this is a straw which shows how the chemical wind is blowing.

New and unheard-of flavors are promised. More healthful food will bring about greater chemical control of disease, with the result that medicine will become more preventive than curative. In fact, Dr. Curtis goes so far as to predict that sickness will be a social disgrace, "like poor teeth."

Dr. Curtis does not like our houses. Too individualistic, he thinks. He is all for standardization and for lighter and stronger materials, fitted together in standard sections. To him windows are inefficient for lighting and ventilating. Dusting ought to go.

Along with fluorescent lighting, power will come through the air, interiors will be of plastic, washable and even of exchangeable materials. There will be glass fabrics and other fireproof and mothproof textiles. Roofs will be used for better living.

The main sources of clothing (cotton and wool) are too variable. There are over a dozen grades of wool on the individual sheep's back, and even these vary with the breed and history of the animal. Such basic variations will not be tolerated in the future, says Dr. Curtis. He wants controlled fibers standard sizes, grades and strengths. Sheets and mats of fibers will compete with woven fabrics when we learn how to solve the problems of softness, strength, pliability and porosity. New finishes which modify the properties of textiles profoundly are already in existence. Develop these and we shall have better control over the wear, "feel" and handle" of textiles.

The automobile is a masterpiece of gadgetry, in Dr. Curtis' eyes. Simplification is already setting in. The car of the future will probably be driven without the aid of a blueprint. Plastic, unbreakable bodies and undentable fenders will contribute to safety.

There should be a great increase in sports, since there seems to be a principle that necessities when eliminated are apotheosized into sports. This has happened with hunting, fishing, running, rowing, archery and horseback riding. May we expect the next candidates to be farming, carpentering and masonry? Dr. Curtis wonders.

Entertainments will be one of our largest industries. There will be radio in public places, as in Germany today. Books will be written for reproduction on films rather than for printing and binding between covers. Most of our pleasures are now concerned with sight and sound. We have done nothing with taste, touch and smell.

Finally, when the means of controlling life in the future are known, Dr. Curtis asks: "Who will control the controllers?" This, he holds, is the research problem of the future. New York Times.

ENZYMES ARE BASIS OF CONSCIOUSNESS

The \$1000 prize of the American Association for the Advancement of Science was awarded recently for the discovery of a biological common denominator.

This denominator clarifies several puzzles, such as the nature of unconsciousness, the mystifying action of sulfanilamide, of vitamins and of temperature and pres-

sure on living bodies.

Three scientists who collaborated in the experiments split the prize. They are Profs. Frank H. Johnson of Princeton University and Dugald E. S. Brown and Douglas A. Marsland of New York University.

Reaction of Enzymes

They showed that enzymes, the compounds which cause chemical reactions in living bodies, are the basis of consciousness, and a part of the other puzzling reactions. The best-known example of an enzyme is the pepsin of digestion.

The three scientists for the first time disclosed how to show the reactions of an enzyme in living tis-

sue.

This enzyme is luciferase, the chemical which emits the light of fireflies, glow worms and luminous creatures which make the sea phos-

phorescent,

One class is the luminous bacteria, whose lights go alternately on and off. The scientists placed these bacteria in water. There they could anesthetize the creatures by putting ether and other drugs in the water. They could change the temperature of the water. They could change

the pressure of the water with a hydraulic pump.

All these things affected the light, and by virtue of many check tests showed exactly what was hapening to the enzyme luciferase.

Alcohol and anesthetics put the light out, if much was given, and dimmed them when the quantities

administered were small.

Changes in temperature, too high or too low, also affected the lights, dimming them or putting them out, and apparently the mechanism was the same, namely change in shape of the enzyme molecules.

However, knockout drops (chloral hydrate) and some other drugs, particularly sulfanilamide and one of the vitamins, set in motion quite a different mechanism, in the enzyme, and yet this different mechanism gave the same dimming and extinguishing of the lights.

These drugs combined with the enzyme to produce a change in its

chemical composition.

Sulfanilamide acted exactly like a narcotic on the enzyme, putting its activities to sleep. Physicians have been trying vainly to discover how sulfanilamide works its miracles. They knew that in test tubes sulfanilamide does not kill germs, but only stops their activities.

They could only guess, however, how it worked in a living body. This enzyme experiment shows one step inside the body. This may mean that the miracle sulfa drugs merely anesthetize or slow down the disease germs so that they are easy prey to the body's natural defenses.


As an explanation of consciousness, the experiments mean that it is primarily a chemical action kept going by the stimulation of enzymes. Anesthetics, including liquor, affect the structure or shape of these enzymes, and unconsciousness is the result.

It also becomes probable that in the needs of a living body to maintain a very uniform temperature, a special, narrow range of heat is required to keep enzymes working properly. — Associated Press.

An interesting report of the activities of the Yogoda Sat-Sanga Society (S.R.F.) and its Centers in India has been recently sent to Paramhansa Yogananda by Brahmachari Santananda of the Ranchi headquarters. The letter is dated August 8, 1941 and reads as follows:

"With regard to the progress of our Society in India, we are gradually receiving recognition and reputation everywhere, more and more. Even in this time of war and financial depression we have, through your grace, been pulling on well with all our departments and centers. We have already informed you that a new Center has been started in Agra (city of the famed Taj Mahal.) There are a number of ardent Yogoda students there.

"Our Calcutta Center is pulling on well. Midnapur Centers are everyday increasing in number, and establishing a honeycomb of religious associations, swelling the number of initiates and devotees.

"The Yogoda Brahmacharya Vidyalaya (High School for boys) at Ejmalichak, Midnapur, has this year won great reputation both by its good results in the last Matriculation Examination and by the noble service of the boys and staff to the needs of the locality, flood relief, etc.

"Purulia Center with its schools is running on nicely; huts have been erected of late.

Ranchi Progress

"Regarding the Ranchi headquarters, things are proceeding very Perfect team work is smoothly. going on now. It is a wonder to many to see that an out-and-out residential school is developing in every respect and winning sound reputation everywhere. Every worker's pious wish and utmost effort are to develop the school and bring it glory. We have the firm conviction that by the month of January 1942 we will be able to increase the number of boys in our roll-call up to 100 if, in the meantime, we can make room or arrange accommodations for more boys. The crection of new dormitories may not be possible during these war days, but we plan to repair and extend in size the building adjoining the library and museum.

"There has been much improvement so far as the teaching of boys is concerned. Last year our boys made good results in the Matriculation Examination. There were three of our boys in the first division which, under the revised regulation of the Calcutta University, is very difficult to secure. There are many other high schools passing more than fifty students who do not have one of their students in the first division.

"Praeceptum Class, gardening and asana (posture) practice have been added to the Ranchi course of studies.

"The Medical Department is running well. We have been receiving medicines at a concession rate from the Government. The number of patients has come up to one hundred daily on an average—almost an equal number to that of the local hospital.

"The Oraon Munda Hindi School is also going on well. The huts have been repaired; only a small portion is yet left unfinished and that too is expected to be completed within a few months after the rains.

Cure of Mental Cases

"The Gymnasium section should take the credit for the beautiful health of all the boys and teachers of the Ashram. A number of good healthy boys come and take part in the Gym from outside homes. Recently a number of lunatics, sent to us by the famous physician for mental diseases, Major Colonel Berkeley Hill, took part in our gymnasium exercises and were com-

pletely cured by means of some of the exercises and simple concentration methods specially adapted for them by our instructor, Krishnakali.

"In spite of country-wide financial depression here, our Fortnightly Lessons Department (Praecepta) is running on well. Our Library and Museum section, though rich in its contents, needs a well-protected separate building when possible.

"On the whole, everything is on its way toward advancement. Monetary depression is a great test for us and our true spirit of service. We hope to overcome all difficulties and pass through this ordeal with flying colors. Paramhansaji, your supreme will goes in and through us, and so long as your will is behind us we will taste no failure."

TITLE OF "PARAMHANSA"

The English equivalent of Paramhansa is "Master."

The title Paramhansa supersedes the title of Swami. The followers of Yogananda's teachings now address him, in accordance with his Guru Sri Yukteswarji's wishes, as Paramhansa (or Paramhansaji. Ji is a term of respect in India and is always used when addressing 1 spiritual teacher, as Guruji, Yoganandaji, Mahatmaji, Swamiji, etc.)

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
