## Spiritual Vibrations of Places

ENGLAND:

definitely determined people, rather confined in ancestral habits and already formed opinions, and sincerely formal. But some of the English politicians in India, drunk with political power, are only hypocritically and externally sincere; they are hide-bound in political selfishness, preventing the recognition and union between the divine brotherhood of spiritual India and utilitarian England.

If the English people in India, instead of keeping aloof from India's spiritual culture and teaching, had tried to merge themselves with her spiritual ideals, as India has adopted England's good material ideals, they would have done away with the possibility of a world race-war between the racially criticized God-made brown Asiatics and the heaven - created white Western brothers.

Selfishness, whether individual, social, or political, is the womb of war. Europe, torn by political selfishness, is showing a very bad example to the world. Germany and Italy invite the oft-quoted, so-called backward yellow race, the oriental nation, Japan, to get ready to fight their own European brothers of France, Russia, and perhaps England.

England is already having rehearsals in the use of gas-proof masks for her people. Many of her offices are already made gas-proof. The newspaper boys of a country are the best informed about the general mental state of that country. One London newspaper boy, when accosted about politics remarked: "It

won't be long before bombs will be falling on crowded London streets. It won't be very pleasant hiding like rabbits in subways." We once met a few boys near the London wharf who, seeing that we came from America, inquired about Mae West, gangsters, Greta Garbo, and movie homes, and sighed when we parted, saying: "Gosh, we wish we could visit America."

The English people are well-dressed and well-groomed; men with swallowtail coats and tall hats, and dress suits, are seen by the broods walking in the afternoon and evening on the streets of London.

Apart from all this, America's influence spiritually, through psychologists and health-food sponsors, has done its share in awakening the latent English spirituality and in bringing it to the surface. There are several thousand Mohammedan English converts. There are thousands of English people who were, and are now, definitely interested in the spiritual culture of India.

England is definitely turning to God. One of the Bishops of England praised Gandhi, but the Bishop of Canterbury was wrong to criticize the Duke of Windsor while he was in France, a self-imposed exile, but didn't dare to criticize him when he was in England as King Edward.

King Edward did not abdicate and renounce public service for private pleasure, or love of a woman, but he preferred the qualities of soul, true love, etc., in preference to the position of a puppet king. King Edward had visited the slums of England and severely criticized conditions there. He asked: "How

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could England produce such slums?" He preferred freedom of thought, speech, and deed rather than be a sullen, mechanical man, renouncing the one love of his soul. He greatly disliked heartless political formalities. He renounced the throne, probably, because he would not be permitted to serve the public in the way he thought best, but would be controlled by political autocrats. King Edward has the sympathy of the whole world; he was busy cultivating sentiments of the heart while the world was busy partially in active or prospective war. He gave up the throne for love, at least that is what he feels now. It does not matter whether he is mistaken or right about Mrs. Simpson. It was wicked of many newspapers to criticize her. She is a clean soul and could not be blamed because she parted from two husbands who did not suit her standards of ideal matrimony. No one, however wise, can be sure before marriage whether his or her consort is going to be ideal.

England's greatest diplomatic mistake was perpetrated in not letting King Edward marry Mrs. Simpson, an American. and thereby cement the friendship of England and America. America, though a democratic country, being descended from the English people, has an innate love for titles, kings, and ceremonies. American aristocracy would have idolized the historical marriage between King Edward and an American lady of high birth.

The Church of England, by its bigotry and criticism of the Duke of

Windsor, has drawn the attention of the truly liberal loving people of England to the littleness of religion and to the magnanimity of the undaunted spirit of youth, symbolized in King Edward's wonderful character. King Edward could have married Mrs. Simpson and remained King, and disciplined Prime Minister Baldwin and the Bishop of Bernard Shaw, H. G. Canterbury. Wells, and all right minded people feel sympathy for King Edward and highly resent the Bishop of Canterbury's unholy wrath against ideal human nature.

King Edward, by renouncing the throne and clinging to love, is not indulging in selfish private pleasure, but he is showing the young people of the world how, for ideal love and true happiness, one should renounce material pomp, money, and power. His pledge of loyalty to the companion of his heart prevented him from being disloyal to his words, sentiments, and ideals. I would have respected the Bishop's opinions about the Duke of Windsor if he had dared to criticize him while he was still King. England's resentment of the bigotry of the Church shows that the English people are soulful and resent religious bigotry.


The English people are great for tenacity and conservatism, mixed with pride and aloofness, with a touch of religious bigotry, but with the tendency to real mental and spiritual freedom.

## The Second Coming of Christ

Steps Toward the Attaining of the Consciousness Which was in Christ Jesus

And the Scribes and Pharisees began to reason in their hearts: why doth this man thus speak blasphemies? Who can forgive sins but God only? And immediately when Jesus perceived in his spirit that they so reasoned within themselves, He, knowing their thoughts, said unto them:

Why reason ye these things? Wherefore think ye evil in your hearts?
Whether is it easier to say to the sick of
the palsy: thy sins be forgiven thee, or
to say, arise, and take up thy bed and
walk? But that ye may know that the
Son of Man hath power on earth to forgive sins, (He saith to the sick of the
palsy,) I say unto thee, arise, and take
up thy bed, and go thy way into thine
house.

THE human consciousness of the materially-minded people could not understand how God-identified Jesus could forgive the results of evil actions. When a glutton eats too much and suffers from acute indigestion, he cannot forgive or relieve the reactions of his greedy actions. If he follows the advice of a doctor, he can relieve himself of stomach trouble.

So, in the spiritual world, the psychologically sick person can be forgiven or freed from the painful results of his actions if he follows the advice of the real spiritual teacher to whom all spiritual errors must be disclosed (confession) for the sake of spiritual diagnosis and the finding and prescribing of the proper remedy. But the sinful priest, who needs to confess his own sins to superior priests, and who has not found forgiveness or relief from his own sins, cannot possibly forgive or relieve other error-makers from sin.

Sin consists of pursuing erroneous ways which lead to physical, mental, and spiritual unhappiness under the lure of happiness. Sin promises happiness and imparts unhappiness. Virtue promises no immediate happiness but positively, ultimately gives lasting happiness. Besides, the sons of God have power like God to relieve us from all the sufferings of our bodies, minds, and souls.

A spiritual and mental healing current can be offered invisibly to offset the effects of evil Karma, or actions, lodged in the brain cells. As acids can dissolve a record, so the mental and physiological grooves in the brain cells of an error-stricken individual can be obliterated by the transmission of Life Force. Erroneous habits can be changed to good habits in individuals. God, who is the maker of souls, minds, and bodies, originally made human beings after the pattern of His Perfect Image, but they chose to desecrate and distort that divine image into a mortal image by the misuse of God-given independence. Ordinarily, human beings in general think that God alone, the Almighty Maker, can change an ignorance-distorted mortal man back to his original perfect divine state as God's perfect image, but materially-minded people fail to realize that the God-knowing saint is one with God. Jesus had often asserted the real truth: "I and my Father are One." And Jesus, being One with the Father, could do everything that God can do. That is why Jesus gave life to Lazarus.

Jesus, being present in the bodies of the doubting Scribes and Pharisees, felt their thoughts and replied to their doubting feelings. Jesus asked the doubting Pharisees: "Why are you concerned about my forgiving the sins of men? Why do you think it is evil to relieve people of their miseries by the power of God acting through Me, or by My power given unto Me by God?"

Jesus signified his complete unity with God, and that He was free from all illusive egotism. Therefore, Jesus explained why He could say to the sick either, "Thy sins be forgiven thee by God, or, "Arise and take up thy bed and walk," or, "I (as the conscious reflection of the power and true image of the Heavenly Father) say unto thee, arise and take up thy bed and go thy way into thine house."

The ordinary person, not one with God in Self-Realization, even though humble, can have the undetected ego hiding in him, even if he humbly says to the sick, "Be healed by God's power." But the superman, who is one with God, does not feel his separating egotism even when he says, "I say unto thee, arise and be healed." Here "I" signifies the "God alone" which the true devotee feels within himself.

True devotees, true Gurus (Preceptors), never feel themselves to be preceptors, for they behold in themselves none other than the pure God. The Guru is the awakened God, awakening the sleeping God in the disciple.

## The Laws of Prosperity and Success

T IS natural for all to want an abundance of all things. Jesus said: "I am come, that ye might have life and that ye might have it more abundantly." In this statement, Jesus was asking all people to have faith in the abundance of the Father. Also, faith that the Father will grant this to all who ask for it. This is not a blind faith, but a scientific and intuitive or spiritual perception of the great law that, Cause and Effect are Inseparable. When a person creates one, he receives the other as a result. It assures the individual that in complying with the spiritual laws, he is bound to be receptive to the unseen but mighty currents of spiritual energy that are emanating from the Father. Thus the Law of Faith "Thou shalt not consider physical appearances, which are but the shadow and outgrowth of spiritual changes, but thou shalt remember that when thou hast decreed a thing, it shall be established unto thee and, sooner than this shall fail, shall the universe itself be destroyed." So our constant affirmation must be: "I am one with the Infinite and Primal Abundance."

All causes of poverty lie in wrong thinking. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." Right positive thinking makes a person one with the Divine creative power, and thus the individual creates conditions and shapes his destiny. In wrong negative thinking, he breaks the Divine connection. So we must first understand that we are under the guidance of the Eternal Father. God is absolute in this universe. We must lay aside our thoughts of worry, fear, and discord. Always hold a glad expectant

heart. There is nothing but good in this universe. We must always use this power of good. Sometimes we may not find it, due to our wrong thinking. Then, simply rest and be conscious of the presence of this power and new vigor will come to you. We must be in rhythm with the Creator of the universe.

Prosperity does not mean the mere possession of property. Prosperity is calm, poised adjustment between the works of the individual and the Divine Father. Success is not the accumulation of wealth merely. It is more. It is abundant love, wisdom, power, and substance. The person who becomes a spiritual magnet can draw into his life whatever he desires, whether it be an automobile, a house, property, or "what not." Christ said: "All mine is thine, and thine is mine."

Why is it then that man does not express and manifest the abundance which belongs to him and has always belonged to him? The reason for this is that he has been one of the millions of thoughtless talkers or wishers and has not tried to comprehend the real meaning of the laws of prosperity and success in his own mind. He must first know within himself just what he wants. It is an initial step to accomplishment.

Mind proper is composed of an inner mind and an outer mind, through both of which it functions. We receive messages from the outer mind which in turn stimulate the inner mind, unfolding the treasure that lies within. In the outer, as well as in the inner mind, God lies. Thus there is no reason that the outer universe should not stimulate us as well. But we must use our judgment and reasoning power to interpret the meaning of the messages of the outer universe.

The beauty, bounty, and abundance of Nature should stimulate all, if those qualities are within and should make us realize the great treasure of Divine Wealth buried within.

To begin with, then, we must center our outer or objective minds upon whatever things, conditions, or states of consciousness that we wish. This can be likened, in a manner, to the mechanical action of a radio. When desiring a certain program that is broadcasted from a certain station, one must tune in with that particular station. It is the same radio that affords you the enjoyment of its various programs, but the tuning in with the proper radio waves is absolutely necessary in order to enjoy that particular program. We have within ourselves a mighty mechanism which is capable of serving us, working for us, and giving us the things that we want. The many types of things that we want are but like radios then. We must tune in with the proper station for the proper program. This hidden or buried power within lies in the inner or the subjective mind. It is God within

We can approach this power through the medium of the outer mind. In the same manner that we open the outer door of our house to enter the interior, similarly access to this interior power lies through the outer door of the objective mind. They are not two separate minds, but are two phases of the same mind, which is divided into two parts for the sake of systematic study and clearer comprehension.

To arouse this power within or make it a working factor in our lives, our desires must be sincere and strong and definite. Confidence must abide within us that we shall receive that for which we are seeking. Jesus Christ said: "According to your faith, be it unto you." "What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them." So, as we become confident of the things that we want and then contact the Divine Power, our

wishes will be fulfilled. But as long as our desires are weak, the objective mind oscillates to and fro, preventing contact with the subjective mind.

It must also be borne in mind that the man who seeks abundance by working at a vocation which he does not hold in high esteem and in which he is not finding joy and happiness, is working against his own best interests, irrespective of his accomplishments. One must never say: "I would like to be a musician, an orator, a painter, or an architect, but I am choosing another vocation because, in that field, I shall be able to earn a better living." Most probably in such a case there will be no great success in the new vocation chosen. Remember, you are a creator, a builder, a master, because you are Divine and you do possess the Will to succeed.

This "Will" to succeed can be demonstrated in our daily life through the medium of three laws, the first of which is "Imagination." Such imagination is not to be confused with day-dreaming, but is an intellectual realization of an individual's desire to express a perfect life, and it is entirely natural and easy for any individual to so do. He will imagine himself successful and prospercus, capable of doing anything and everything. He will never worry, never fear, but will always keep in mind his Oneness with the Father. "Never look at the visible supply; always see the limitless riches in Formless Substance and know that they are coming to you as fast as you can receive them and use them."

The second law in demonstrating the Will to succeed is to fix the natura thought and reasonableness of the prosperity so firmly in mind that the old beliefs and habits will not be able to block the path of success and prosperity We must permeate and transform the subconscious mind with the realization of success. Our old habits and idea are our main enemies. They constantly whisper that the law will not work, and we bring our own downfall. Christ said "In the world ye shall have tribulation but be of good cheer; I have overcom the world." Drown the voices of failur

IGHT hangs like a great black jinni over Calcutta. Who released him from the corked-up blue bottle of the sky? The ever-latrant monotony of American jazz reaches us even out here on this secluded balcony of the city's most pretentious and most West-Our illustrious comernized hotel. panion, Mr. Bahadur, sits across the table engrossed in a discussion of how India may safely assume self-rule. But I do not hear him. My thoughts fly on their own far courses and bring back the remembrance of the disappointments before the time of the coming of these thoughts. The moronic charivari from within wells up and drops dead sud-In the street below is another world.

In defiance and contradistinction to this breathless life of haste and noise above them, loose-robed figures file by like leisurely phantoms below. Tiny brown feet tread past and brilliant saris rustle against the darkness. And all at once I am remembering our walk to Kalighat and of the terrible but tender Mother, Kali-Ma.

"What? Oh, I beg your pardon! I was for the moment distracted. You were saying?"

Mr. Bahadur continues: "I said, let the West as a race, yes, as a ruling race, show one iota of unselfish love, one smallest mite of tolerant solicitation, and like Hanuman, the monkey-god, India will leap over the wall of political dissidence and racial incongruities, and will embrace her brother."

I cannot think of these things tonight. The enchanted, creepsome half-light of the street, sensually magnetic, jars with the dissonant sounds of jazz music and

carefully chosen words. Life is warm and feeling and good, down there against the dusty earth. Up here it is a protracted nothingness which we try to fill with lofty philosophies and many words. This thought, the thought of my people, is vaguely disturbing; somewhere beneath the vestiture of rhetoric, alcohol, and vanity there is something real and living in them too; something moving unseen, but with the same fullpulsing vigor. But they are prisoners in their own minds. They dare not emerge, for out there in the street lurk evil things inimical to their fastidious ethos.

At last it is time to go. We politely outdo each other in our assertions of gratitude and the assurance that we have superbly enjoyed ourselves. But I am restive. I beg Dayanand to go with me for a long walk in the nocturne streets; he is Eastern, he will understand my mood and not intrude. So we walk and walk in the intimate darkness, my thoughts revolving around the core of a strange remembrance. We sit down by the river, and yet my thoughts are like small, nest-seeking birds. They become the words of my Guru:

"You have wondered why Kali is such an important goddess in India? But you must soon observe that this is because of Kali's peculiar nature. As you know, every God has a wife who is his shakti, or force; but with the exception of Kali, the others are forces of merely a potential kind, called into actualization only under particular necessity. Kali, on the other hand, who is the wife of Shiva, is the creator and mother of all things finite. To speak quite plainly, she is a great Indian ideal, for it is through her that the Absolute becomes manifest as Nature, and it is Kali, or the cosmic

POET\* wrote this line, but it is more practical and its verity is more clearly brought out by human history than most of the scorn of the short-sighted, materialistic, non-imaginative "Grad-Grinds" of all the ages.

Who has given most to the world? The so-called practical man or the dreamer? All men of action are dreamers, says James Huneker in his "Pathos of Distance." Looking back over human history, even in its assumedly materialistic development, we are impressed by the contributions of "thorists," "dreamers." In fact, almost without exception the great names in science, particularly in its branches of physics and chemistry, have dreamed dreams. Recall the reply of the great Faraday to the scoffer who referred to his discoveries in connection with the electric current as "the flimsiest theorizing of no practical value." "Some day," rejoined Faraday, "governments will tax this thing for revenue."

The dreamer dies, but his vision, in spite of opposition—even persecution—persists, until on another day it becomes a living reality. "The children raise monuments to those whom their fathers stoned."

"A dreamer lives forever, while a toiler dies in a day," sang John Boyle O'Reilly, in his beautiful poem, "The Cry of the Dreamer." How true! Show us some one who can light up the imagination of another and you have shown us some one who is in possession of something infinitely more powerful than gunpowder, something that gunpowder or any other man-made force is powerless to stop. Yes, the men who have most richly and powerfully endowed the ages that followed them with their influence have been dreamers.

Dreamers may not all be pleasant, but dreaming usually is comforting and pleasing. The poets believe so.

"A place of dream, the Holy Land, Hangs midway between Earth and Heaven."

In these words Harriet Prescott Spofford describes what to her is the "Holy Land," while Thomas Lowell Beddoes, in his "Dream Peddlary," asks us:

### Diet and Health

#### DINNER MENU

Potato and Watercress Soup Grapefruit and Orange Salad Lentils Spanish Style Beets with Apples Frozen Cinnamon Custard

### POTATO AND WATERCRESS SOUP

Vegetable Stock seasoned with Vegex

3 or 4 potatoes

1 bunch watercress, finely chopped

4 egg yolks

1 cup warm milk

3 tablespoons grated cheese

Vegetized salt

1 tablespoon butter

Grate the uncooked potatoes, add them to the boiling stock and simmer for ½ hour. Five minutes before serving add the chopped cress. Put the slightly beaten egg yolks in the soup tureen, stir in the cup of warm milk and the butter and gradually stir in a few tablespoons of the hot soup. Pour in remainder of soup and sprinkle with grated cheese.

#### LENTILS SPANISH STYLE

Soak lentils in cold water for 12 hours. Put them in a saucepan, cover them with cold salted water, bring to the boil and cook till tender. Drain and put the lentils in a frying pan with 1 or 2 chopped onions fried to a golden brown, 1 or 2 chopped tomatoes, a clove of garlic (optional), and season with smoein (smoked vegetable seasoning powder) mix all thoroughly, season with vegetized salt and cook 15 minutes. Sprinkle with chopped parsley and serve very hot.

#### BEETS WITH APPLES

Peel and slice 4 small cooked beets and put them in a pan with 4 tablespoons butter, 1 minced onion, 4 finely chopped sour apples, and season with vegetized salt and plenty of nutmeg. Simmer until reduced to a pulp.

#### FROZEN CINNAMON CUSTARD

1 cup brown or raw sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

2 tablespoons whole wheat flour

2 egg yolks

1 pint milk

2 egg whites

I cup cream, whipped

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix the sugar, flour and cinnamon, stir in the beaten egg yolks and the milk gradually. Cook until thick and smooth is a double boiler. Cool. Add the beaten egg whites and vanilla and fold in the whipped cream. Put in tray of an automatic refrigerator until frozen.

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## The Problem of Immortality

What is that reality then? That reality is intelligence, beauty and life. all objects there is intelligence. Every object moves by the power of reason. Look at the heavenly bodies, how systematically they move. These cosmic phenomena are not a chance production out of chaos. The theory that cosmos came from chaos has been rightly discarded. There is system, reason, intelligence throughout the whole world. In some instances it is more fully manifested than in others. Everywhere it is manifested according to its requirement. The greater the demand for intelligence, the more it will be manifested. Therein lies the whole science of progress. In fact, matter, energy and intelligence are essentially the same reality. reality is intelligence, consciousness. There is no difference between these three except in their different modes of manifestation. Intelligence is the reality. Will is its manifesting power. Energy is the objective vibration of will. Matter is the gross form of energy.

Every object manifests beauty. To each of us, things appear ugly or beautiful because each looks at them from a relative state of consciousness, with limited vision. But one who is able to realize beauty in its purest state finds all objects beautiful. Our idea of beauty is conditioned by external objects; it is relative. To us, today's beauty may be tomorrow's ugliness. Similarly, all things manifest life. Without life there could be no manifestation. Life is the power in all creation.

These three realities, intelligence, feeling (beauty) and life, constitute the underlying reality in all objects. No existence is possible without these three. They are called realities because they are universal and eternal. These three

principles are within all of us. Why do we act intelligently? Because the infinite intelligence is within us. Why do we love? Because infinite love is What sustains life within within us. us? It is the universal existence. These three constitute the soul. Soul is in all. Do you know there is soul in a piece of stone, in a grain of sand, in a flower, in a fruit, in animals and birds, as well as in you and me? Forget, once and for all, the belief that man alone possesses a soul. All have soul, the same soul that you and I have. Nothing can exist without soul. This soul is eternal, immortal. Nothing can ever destroy it.

"Know this, O Arjuna! that the whole universe is permeated by the imperishable One. None can destroy this imperishable reality." The eternal life is in you, in me, in all. But through force of age-long habit we perceive life only in its objectified state, in its limited manifestation. Therefore, we think life is finite. We are conscious of life only through an object in which it is manifested. We conceive of life by looking at a living object, such as, for instance, a plant or a human being. When I see a living human being I realize there is life. Today I am conscious of life in me, but I am conscious of it through my external being, my body, my senses. Our consciousness of life is arrested only by the objects in which it is present. In other words, we look at life through a limited medium, instead of realizing life itself. Hence, our conception that life is finite. Our eyes are not yet opened. The human mind is not yet disentangled from the senses so that we may realize life in its universal aspect. As long as we are in the consciousness of finitude, we fail to realize immortality. But the moment we free ourselves from sensory identification we realize eternity, immortality.

Calm your mind; rise above the thought of finitude; all objective consciousness will vanish; all that limits and objectifies life will be gone; and you shall realize pure life, eternal life, universal life, absolute existence. Attainment of immortality is the realization of that universal life independently of its objective manifestation. Man is that life.

Life is eternal reality. Our subjective consciousness of it is the proof. Consciousness of life does not depend upon the objective world. If it were so, then the death of one living object would have destroyed, at least partially, the consciousness of life. But it does not. Is our consciousness of life diminished by the death of anyone in the family? Certainly not. Similarly, if all objects were destroyed, our consciousness of life would remain unimpaired. Life itself is changeless, it is indestructible. Who can destroy life? Think of the millions and millions of men, women, children, and other creatures that have died. Has that destroyed life? No. Only the forms are changed. The finite container of life is broken. shell is inert, but not the inner life. The body is dead, not the life that was within. Life is eternal. Forms have temporary existence. Soul never dies. Soul is eternal. That eternal soul is within you and within me. Yea, verily, you are that soul. I am that soul. To realize the soul is to realize immortality.

No man can truly believe that his soul is mortal. Yet no religion or belief can grant immortality to soul; it is already immortal. You cannot gain immortality; you can only realize it. Realize that you are immortal. No matter what erroneous conception man may have about soul, he must still believe that his soul does not die. This belief is intuitive. Those who cherish in their hearts the hope of eternal existence as finite beings, in reality believe in the immortality of soul. All religions believe in the immortality of soul. Without accepting this as the fundamental truth, religion has no value. Religion shows us the way to realize immortal soul. Desire for immortality is in all.

Immortality is a categorical fact in human life, but when we look at life from the finite standpoint, we cannot

realize its immortality. Realization can only be complete when we are out of finiteness. The bird sitting on the branch of the tree is concerned only with the branch, and not with the whole tree. When you attend a concert, if you should concentrate your attention, for example, on the harp alone, you could not comprehend or enjoy the harmony of the whole composition; you would have lost the whole value of the music if the harp should stop playing for a few measures. So it is with life; by concentrating on one aspect of manifestation of life, you lose sight of universal existence.

Soul and body are not forever identified. Although soul can exist independently of body, the body depends on soul for its existence. There are some who believe that body and soul must forever be together. They contend that soul cannot exist without body. Let these people think a little, and their ignorance will be dispelled. Take, for instance, a child. A child has a soul. Where was the soul of the child before it was born? Who created the soul of the child? Suppose we admit that it was created by God and was with God before it came into the body. Then soul did exist without a body. Let us assume that the child did not have any previous birth or death; that it has just started on the path of existence. Even in that case, we are forced to acknowledge that the soul of the child did exist without a body. If soul could exist without a body, then why will it not be able to exist independently again, hereafter?

Moreover, if we are to believe that soul cannot exist without a body, what has happened to all those who are Where are their souls? their souls lying in graves, each with its respective body? If so, why are they dead at all? Death means the separation of soul from the body. If a person is dead, and yet we are to believe that his soul is in the body, then we must admit that soul is not the lifegiving power, nor a living reality. You know the foolishness of such a contention, the absurdity of such a belief. Think again of a soul lying in darkness, stagnant, non-active, hidden, useless, encased in the grave with a dead body.

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## Scientific Digest

#### Death in Middle Age

M ANY men between the ages of 45 and 60 die suddenly because they eat too much, said Dr. Harrison S. Martland of Newark, chief medical examiner of Essex County, N. J., addressing the closing session of the New York State Medical Society convention. Dr. Martland based his conclusions on 1,000 cases of sudden death.

"As we grow older, I believe we eat too many dairy products," he said. "I agree with Dr. Timothy Leary of Boston that we eat too many foods high in cholesterol content as we pass the 40 mark. By that I mean butter, eggs,

cream, and other dairy foods."

Investigating his list, Dr. Martland found that the great majority of deaths occurred between 45 and 60 years of age, and that it was unusual for young adults or the very old to die unexpected-

lv.

He found that more than 80 per cent of the deaths were of males, and that deaths were due to the hardening of the coronary arteries and its sequelae in a large part of the cases. Many occurred in middle-aged men who were overweight and ate large meals, and in those where worry, fright, and emotional upset brought on complications.

Editor's Note: It certainly makes me feel good to see all these medical men turning their attention to diet. It won't be very long now before medicine will discard all its drugs, and fruit and vegetable markets will be doing the work that

drugs were supposed to do.

## Device Which Reveals Secrets of the Body

DEVELOPMENT of a device which utilizes animal electricity to reveal secrets of the body was announced re-

cently by Yale scientists. The instrument, a vacuum tube microvoltmeter, may rival the microscope as a means of studying biological processes of life, reported the Yale authorities who have made thousands of measurements with it.

The instrument can measure bodily electrical charges as small as five one-millionths of a volt, indicating alterations in physiological activity before they can be detected by other methods now available.

Dr. Harold S. Burr, professor of anatomy; Dr. Cecil T. Lane of the physics department, and Dr. Leslie N. Nims of the physiology department developed the device. With it they have conducted experiments on a wide variety of animals, from fish to man, and have found that each species has a characteristic electrical pattern which changes whenever a minute variation in the living process occurs.

#### Artificial Radio Activity

A CHEAP and safe artificial product soon may replace radium, expensive and dangerous element, in the treatment of certain diseases, Dr. William D. Harkins, University of Chicago chemist, said recently. Such common substances as sodium (constituent of table salt) may artificially be made radio active by bombarding them with neutrons, minute particles of the element neutron. Artificial radio activity also may be produced by uniting certain substances with helium nuclei or the nuclei of heavy hydrogen atoms.

"Artificial radio activity is comparatively short-lived," Dr. Harkins explained, "varying from a minute or two to a few years, depending upon the substance used. This gives it a tremendous advantage over radium, which

By being hateful and ugly to anyone, we give new and more powerful cause, which creates greater hatred within us and draws others of a hateful nature towards us.

Suppose all your life you have suffered from some sickness; you can avoid that in your future life by following these principles:

- (1) By your will to be well. If you mentally affirm and strongly desire to be well, that impression will regulate and shape your next body.
- (2) By serving others, especially those who are sick. By serving those who are sick, you create a vibration of good health in them. That vibration will bring the impression of good health in you and will give you good health in your next life. These are not fantastic thoughts. This is truth. By nursing a sick tree, you give the cause of good health in you. It radiates its good health in you. It radiates its good health, and that radiation goes in and through you. Then again, your desire to bring good health to your patient also helps you in securing a good body in your future life.
- (3) By prayer. Suppose you have someone for whom you cannot do anything physically; you can still pray. Prayer is divine radiation. If you pray, your prayer will help your loved ones to be well in future lives. It will help you, too. Prayer is a mighty power.
- (4) By charity. In giving health and comfort to others through charity and similar kindliness, you prepare yourself to acquire a good body.

process of Creation, that veils the Absolute from us. She is the eternal, moving soul of things, the force behind all realities. By identifying ourselves with her, we attain to complete emancipation. Lo, she is the mother of us all! She is tender and loving, the Everlasting Mother who suffers because of our pain. Says Shankaracharyia:

'It is she with whom Shiva seeks shelter;
Whose words are sweet,
The Destructress of Ills,
Ever and in all places pervading;
Tender Creeper of Intelligence and
Bliss!'

And how she wept, my son, at the great Deluge; how she longed to reach out her many arms and gather her children from darkness and despair! How she comes to us when no man is aware, softly, through the blue afterglows of sorrow, and calls our name. When the world of excruciating failures and painful apostasies presses too hard upon you, and when the bonds you have formed in illusion, burst, bringing you suffering, then, even then, lift up your arms through the darkness and soon you will feel an answering grip, and your hands will be caught in the infinite grasp of Kali-Ma, and you will know that you are no longer alone."

It was not unusual that my Guru was so moved by the ideal of divine mother-hood. Most Hindus are. To the female aspect of God they devote themselves with a passionate love that is both beautiful and strong. One of my greatest surprises upon becoming intimate with Indian beliefs and ideals was to learn with what great respect they regard women.

Once Dayanand said to me: "If women of the West, through misinformation and ignorance of truth, pity their Eastern sisters of the purdah, let them save their sympathy, for the truth is that the women of India are better loved and respected than their sex of the West. The Hindu law-giver, Manu, said centuries ago: 'The mother exceedeth a

thousand fathers in the right to reverence and in the function of women.' And in the Kubjika Tantra we read: 'Whoever hath seen the feet of woman, let him worship them as his teacher.'

What is the secret of this respect, this apotheosis of womanhood in India? We do not have to look far for an explana. India's women are content with the business of being wives and mothers. They have retained that beautiful, allsurpassing tenderness of perfect womanhood, of the holy Mother Kali. They possess that kind solicitation and desire to serve, which is woman's crowning attribute. Man has not changed greatly with the passing of Ages; he is still the child-at-heart human, longing at times to forsake the fevered activity and vicissitudes of life; and it is then more than ever that he appreciates the ineffable magic of woman's touch and sympathy.

Has our poet not sung: 'You came for a moment to my side and touched me with the great mystery of the woman that is in the heart of Creation.' We Hindus believe that a woman must be the high priestess of man's secret inner existence, wherein he seeks refuge from the gross indignities and cruel perfidies of the world. And in this role of compassion and sympathetic understanding, woman commands the love and respect of man more than she possibly can through all her intellectual and social achievements put together. The Indian woman is a mother; therein lies her glory."

The heaven-reflecting river moves on silently. The great white moon retreats behind a wimpled archipelago of clouds. And all at once, by a swift transmutation of thought into vision, I behold her—the Holy Mother. I see her stretch out her arms in longing and entreaty; hear her speak, her words like notes of music from the deep-throated silence of futurity. But you will not understand what I feel. The whole scene must seem overdrawn, fanciful. Yet, sitting in the placid East Indian night with my eyes closed to all foreign sights and turned inward upon myself, the image is real to me, more real than my own far-away hands. And her words I shall remember; words that are importunate, strong, torrential.

"Call them unto me, with their exquisite beautiful aspirations, their light faces, their blossoming bodies. Lay them in the sweep of my arm's curve, against me. I am Kali, the iconoclast, destroying all, creating all; rejoicing in their tremulous shyness, in their hesitation, their glow. Bring them into my rendezvous, into the privacy of my sleeping place, into the mellow darkness, the purple glows of night. And I will show them sights, cities, tears, setting sunsdevastation! I will make them behold the wordless freedom, the blissful awakening. I will confide in them the secret of etesian winds, dripping the indissoluble scents. Seat them beside me in the unclouded amber of dusk, under the fountain of champak, under the slopes where stars abide. There I will teach them the words of power, those lost words, those syllables of silence. There I will speak of the unimagined magic, of future mantra, credoes, priests. There I will sing, stitching with the words of song, garments of the man to come. Call them unto me."

Suddenly I emerge from the wilderness of selfish aims into the shoreless atmosphere of a new omnipresence, linking me to all life. You find such an experience exaggerated? It is not. In India, in the space of a moment, your life can resolve itself into a startling singleness; and your eye being single, your body is full of light. You look upon a village asleep in the stars, and a



You meet a gray-haired ancient on the dusty thoroughfare of Hindustan and, with one look from his benign eyes, you are ready to leave all and follow him to the ends of the earth. Why? I cannot tell, only that there arises within you suddenly the remembrance of a longago dream, and you believe in it. You are no longer uncertain, no longer without a purpose. With the bard of Shantiniketan, you realize that "When old words die out on the tongue, new melodies break forth from the heart."
