Nervousness -- Cause and Cure

ervousness is a malady which can be overcome by a specific medicine--calmness. The disturbance of mental equilibrium which results in nervous disorders is caused by continuous states of excitement or excessive stimulation of the senses. Indulgence in constant thoughts of fear, anger, melancholy, remorse, envy, sorrow, hatred, discontent or worry, and lack of the necessities for normal and happy living, such as tight food, proper exercise, fresh air, sunshine, agreeable work and a purpose in life, are the causes of all nervous diseases.

Any violent or persistent mental, emotional or physical excitement causes a disturbance of the balance in the flow of life force throughout the sensory-motor mechanism and the bulbs of the senses. It is as though we put a two-thousand volt current through a fifty-watt lamp. The lamp-wires would be burned out. In the same way, the nervous system cannot withstand the assault of intense, destructive thoughts and feelings.

Nervousness appears to many as a simple problem, but it is a deadly enemy, with far-reaching results. It is difficult to heal a man of any disease, so long as he suffers from nervousness. The unbalanced life force in his body makes it a tremendous task for him to concentrate or meditate deeply enough to acquire peace and wisdom. Nevertheless, nervousness can be easily cured by anyone who is willing to analyze his condition and remove the disintegrating emotions which are tearing him apart, day by day. Analysis and calmness in all situations of life will heal the most stubborn case.

Realization that all power to think, speak, feel and act comes from God, and that He is ever with us, inspiring and guiding us, brings an instant freedom from nervousness. Flashes of divine joy will come with this realization; sometimes a deep illumination will pervade the being, banishing the very conception of fear. The power of God sweeps in like an ocean, surging through the heart as a cleansing flood, removing all obstacles from our path. The delusion of matter, the consciousness of being only a mortal body, is overcome by contacting the sweet serenity of Spirit, attainable by daily meditation. The victim of nervousness must understand his case, and must reflect on those continual mistakes of thinking which are responsible for his maladjustment to life. When the nervous man once admits to himself that his disease is not mysterious in its cause, but the logical outcome of his own habits, he is already half cured.

The Nervous System

The nervous system is the telephonic outlet and inlet of the body, providing man with his response to outer and inner stimuli. Excitement dislocates the nervous balance, sending too much energy to some parts and depriving others of their normal share. This lack of proper distribution of nerve force is the sole cause of nervousness. The calm man, one who avoids excitement because he is not overly attached to his ego and is aware that God, and not he, is running this universe, is always able to meet any situation in life because his nerve force is equilibrated. This is the goal we must strive for and attain.

The nervous system supplies life current to the brain, heart and other parts of the body. It distributes energy to the five senses of sight, sound, touch, taste, and feeling. Nerves are our medium of contact with the outer world and the source of all our sensory reactions. How important it is, therefore, to keep the nerves in a state of perfect balance, not shocking one part of the body with too much energy and consequently limiting the supply to other regions. Not by restlessness or emotional reactions, but by calmness, by deep trust in God, we reach the yogis state of an equilibrated being.

The yogis have special techniques by which one can revive tissues burned out by nervousness, by sending life energy into nerves partially destroyed by mistreatment. Each cell and tissue in the nervous system is a living, intelligent structure. Life energy can always renew it.

Nervousness is of two kinds psychological and mechanical, or superficial and organic. The psychological or most common variety is due to mind excitement. This condition, long continued in, and accompanied by wrong diet and association with uninspiring people, causes the chronic or organic manifestations of nervous disease.

Choice of company is all-important. Tell me what kind of friends a man has and I will tell you what he is. Flatterers do not help us. We should seek the society of superior men -- those who tell us the truth and help us to improve ourselves. He is our best friend who humbly suggests how we may benefit our life by worth-while changes.

Brutal, harsh criticism is like hitting a man on the head with a hammer. The power of love is infinitely more effective. The gentle voice of suggestion can accomplish wonders, whereas crude faultfinding does not reach the desired goal. Only a perfected man should undertake to fully judge another. The effort spent in judging one's self is the only profitable analysis.

Seek Society of Sages

Association with calm, wise people is one of the quickest ways to banish nervousness and realize our innate divinity. When a criminal is put in the company of other criminals, he receives no benefits. On the eve of his departure from prison, the warden, out of his experience, thinks: "When will he be back?" Nervous people should stay away from those suffering from similar troubles. Too much sleep drugs the nerves, and too little sleep is hurtful to them. The diet should be simple, balanced and not too plentiful. But the best cure of nervousness is cultivation of calmness.

One who is naturally calm does not lose his sense of reason, justice or humor under any circumstances. He can always separate sentiment or wishful thinking from fact. He is not led astray by improbable schemes of unearned wealth or by the honeyed tongues of dishonest men. He does not poison his bodily tissues with anger or fear, which adversely affect circulation. It is a well-proven fact that the milk of

an angry mother can seriously poison her child. What more striking proof can we

ask for, that violent emotions will finally reduce the body to an ignominious wreck?

Poise is a beautiful thing. We should steer our life by a triangular guide: Calmness and Sweetness are the two sides; the base is Happiness. Every day, one should remind himself: "I am the prince of peace, sitting on the throne of poise." Whether one acts quickly or slowly, in solitude or the busy marts of men, his center should be peaceful, poised. Christ has given us the ideal. Everywhere, he demonstrated peace. He passed through every conceivable test without losing his poise.

The body is like a little bubble of energy in the cosmic sea. God is everywhere, controlling planets, galaxies; yet He is not disturbed. Though He is above this world, He is yet in this world. We must reflect His image and likeness. We must meditate often and hold on to the peaceful after-effects. We must send out thoughts of love, goodwill, harmony. In the temple of meditation, with the light of intuition burning on the altar, there is no restlessness, no nervous striving or searching. Man is truly home at last, in a sanctuary not made with hands.

Self- Surrender

Arjuna, the Lord dwells as the inherent Self in the hearts of all beings, who are mounted on the wheel of this body, causing them by His power of maya to revolve according to their actions.

"O Bharata, seek refuge in Him alone whole-heartedly. By His grace you will obtain supreme peace and the eternal abode." -Bhagavad Gita XVIII, 61-62. So long as man goes on asserting his vain egotism, he can never be happy. As the intelligence of a man grows, his consciousness of power also grows; but at the same time he becomes painfully aware of the limitations of that power. Thus intelligence makes a man aware of his own greatness, but also makes him aware of his limitations. The consciousness of his limitations brings him more pain than the joy he gets by an awareness of his powers. Hence it is that genius suffers from pain most. But when man realizes his oneness with God, all pain leaves him. Happiness can never exist along with perpetual want. The egotistic self can never be happy. The assertion of one's individuality is at the same time a negation of our relationship with the cosmic life. Through such assertion we ignore the fact that we are merely tools in the Divine Hand. We can be happy only in so far as we act according to the nature of our true being--that is, in so far as we surrender ourselves to the will of God.

The egotistical individual, one who does not believe in divine dispensation, suffers from a thousand phobias. Recently the writer met an individual suffering from the obsession that he was going shortly to be hanged. The man was otherwise quite sane. He wanted to get rid of the fixation but the greater the effort he made to be free from it, the stronger did it become. He was worried all the time by the painful thought; it haunted him everywhere like an evil genius. One can be free from an evil genius; but who can free himself from his own evil thoughts! There was no way out. He was so miserable due to the oppressing thought that he wanted to commit suicide.

This is an abnormal case. But most of us who are called normal do suffer from

obsessions that oppress us throughout our lives. It is true that they leave us at times, but others take their place at once. We differ in this respect from the lunatics only in the degree of our abnormality and not in kind. The wisest among us seem to be caught in the mesh somehow. Are we not often oppressed by the thought that some evil is going to befall us, though as a matter of fact the evil may never come? We are afraid beyond measure of our own failures, of criticisms of our conduct by others, of misfortunes and what not. At times we become introspective and see the folly of our own thinking. We realize that, after all, the failures, the criticisms. and the misfortunes may never come, or—even if they do—we can bear them.

Nature Cures Us

By dwelling on negative thoughts we make our minds so weak that we find ourselves helpless in getting rid of the oppressing worries. It is only nature that cures us of our worries by bringing about a change in the environment and thus creating distractions to relieve us of our fixations. But such relief is only temporary. The mind is not made strong and we are relieved of one trouble only to get into another.

Often we invite actual misfortunes by dwelling on them. Thoughts actualize themselves into objective events if they are allowed to stay for long. Many a failure of life would not have come had we not thought of failures. But, after all, it is not the failures themselves that are so depressing as the thoughts of failure. The real pain of death lies in the thought of death.

The remedy to get rid of such a diseased state of mind lies in believing in the Eternal Mother and leaving oneself like a child to Her care.

When we rely on out own power for success, anxiety comes. For the power that really makes an individual succeed is the power of God.

In the Kenopanithad, the story of the various gods, Wind, Fire and Water, disputing among themselves as to who is the greatest, brings home beautifully the lesson of the impotence of the individual. All energy, all vitality comes from the One Source, and as long as we keep ourselves connected with that Source, so long are we strong. There is no power in any individual but that of God; there is no beauty in any creation but His.

These days psychic disorders are increasing. It is one of the chief characteristics of the present civilization that there is a larger number of mentally unhealthy persons in society today than ever before. Civilization has increased the demands of life, raised our standards of living. Our aspirations have been expanded, but the corresponding supply is not forthcoming. For one mouth that grabs the dainties, there are twenty in the world that go without the ordinary morsel. For one cleanly dressed gentleman riding in a motor, there are a hundred covered with dust, and an equally lame number working in smoky or dark dungeons. The latter have souls as living as the former; when the former are enjoying the high luxuries of life, the latter are feeling its pinches. It is natural that those who go in the cars should remain as unhappy as those who have to bear the dust raised by them. When there is a disturbance in the psychic atmosphere, it is bound to affect everyone.

Selfish Society

To what is it all due? It is because of man's being lost in matter. The joys of the flesh are all that we know. Materialism today is grinding down humanity. The rich are lost in their wealth, the poor in their misery. Neither is happy. While the poor suffer from physical pain, the rich suffer from mental pain. The favored men of the world, those in power, often deprive the poor masses of their only consolation in life—namely, religion. Now there is nothing to ease their

emotional tension. It must naturally result in general mental instability and derangement.

This mental derangement is bringing about social disorder also. Humanity is unhappy; the slave nations are unhappy because of their exploiters, the exploiters are unhappy because of mutual jealousy. The so-called wise men of the world want to bring about peace. They call conferences and make pacts. A host of propagandists go out to preach the values of peace. But how can there be peace without when there is no peace within? And obviously there can be no peace within when we have not found our souls.

The burden of materialism must be removed before humanity can have peace. Sham preaching of "Good Will" cannot do this, but only actual sacrifice in the service of the Lord. He alone will be saved who loses himself in Him. The present mental unrest is the symptom of a disease that is very deep-rooted. In our pride, we have forgotten the Great Life from which we emerge, in which we remain, to which we all go. We have tried to disconnect ourselves from the Source of Life. How then can we live? It is committing suicide.

The lesson that was taught by Sri Krishna several thousand years ago is the lesson of eternal life, of eternal joy. The same lesson has been repeated by other prophets and sages again and again in all lands. And the lesson is—the Ego is nothing, the Lord is everything. This is what in substance the Buddha said, this is what Jesus said, this is what Spinoza said—in fact, the saints and sages of all times have said the same thing. They have allowed the flesh to be crucified in order that the soul might be saved—they have given up their all to gain the love of God. -Kalyana Kalpataru.

ot that the place or the time matters-and yet it is recorded in my mind that it was on a summer vacation, many years ago, at a small inn in New Hampshire by the sea that I first read this sentence of Emerson:

"The way of life is wonderful;

It is by abandonment."

At the moment I was not especially impressed. Forgotten is the title of the book, and its contents, in which Emerson was quoted. Forgotten are the names and the faces of the other guests at the inn who dined and enjoyed the surf together. Forgotten are their expressed interests and fears, their various afflictions and limitations, their constant conversation (isn't it always constant?), and their hearts' loves, their sentences, if any, about God. Forgotten who was our President at the time; forgotten the state of my health and finances; forgotten what year and the styles thereof, what the mode decreed for this outer picture of such paramount importance to the feminine heart. Even forgotten today are the specific problems and perplexities, from which the light in this sentence: "The way of life is wonderful; it is by abandonment", has given me relief and surcease. Even forgotten the sentence! But at times of difficulty, of need, many times it has flashed back to me, like a picture of apples of gold in a frame of silver, and given me peace and comfort from an invisible realm.

In the daily grind, the pettiness we focus on seems to hold us and keep us in the mud, contemplating the difficulties of earthly things with which we blindly cope with mundane weapons and efforts. But anon, some circumstance, some chain of events, will bring out instantly from nothing, from nowhere, supernatural help.

So, once again, after I know not how long, this sentence has come again to my meditation, and opened up vistas of realization that the sentences of the mystics, and of the illumined, live eternally. There is within them the ageless

soul, God, life; they fit in any epoch, in any country, untouched by the boundaries of race, religion, government, science, art, life or death. They are the essence of the inner vision, and flow into any cup. With them, we march to the beat of another drum. They quicken within us areas that sleep while we think with the conscious mind. When those areas leap to recognition, it is as though we took hold of substance for the first time.

To the material mind, soul truths are illusive, intangible, but even the material scientists agree that there is no matter, no material universe. We touch the divine in such a mystical and unknown way, yet it encompasses us and sustains us, and gives us this vision and perception, that by its touch—it matters not on land or sea—we recall its deep familiarity. We have read it before. We have heard it before.

We know some basic power within us, unexpressed, something not of temporal values, judgments, decisions, is of more moment, more value to God and to ourselves, than any other force. If we are true to this vision, it will bear more fruit even in our world than if we do not dare to believe, to follow, to hope, and allow ourselves to be held down by the common consent. The divine IS, and man is divine. If there ever was or ever will be a divine power, it is now. How else would it get through from the past to the future? And if it is, we can find this region in ourselves, we can shift to it, in the most unexpected ways and places.

Inspirational Sentence

Emerson's sentence has held for me a childlike love and trust. It has been a secret thing—not that I meant it to be. Occasionally I have told it to some friend—but I saw only a passing interest. I have never read fully the books of Emerson. Our family had beautifully bound copies in the library, but with other studies—tend so many dishes to do, and meals to get—they were unread. I have driven many rimes through Concord and seen Emerson's home, and visited the cemetery there, and dreamed of what he stood for. As I look back, it was a shadow passing a shadow.

After many years what can we remember of details; what is worth remembering? If we could consciously live our today with less stress on the changing things, and with more love for that which is to be the eternal and is eternal even now! After years have passed, it is not anything that appeals to the five senses that remains most vividly in my memory, but I have come to prize another faculty, that which detects the quality and character of real worth, the glorious quality of the eternal! Instead of discriminating after twenty years, why not sift as we go?

So meanly we live, so little we think of the divine. But the soul will transform any forbidding appearance. This force that is just beyond reach, that we dare not touch to bend to our ends— if we will just let it but BE, we would live more consciously with one hand ahold of the Infinite. We ought to walk consciously through things, even on a sentence — "The way of life is wonderful, It is by abandonment."

BHAGAVAD GITA

Methods of Contacting the Higher Astral Angels who Supervise the Workings of Cosmic Law Underlying, all Human Destinies

Chapter 111, Stanza 9

Literal Translation:

Worldly people are bound by activities different from those which are initiated for the purpose of Yajna; O Son of Kunti, being nonattached, therefore do thou work for Yajna or religious rites only.

Poetic Rendition:

Materially minded men are imprisoned by diverse activities which differ from divine duties. O offspring of Kunti, remaining aloof within, devote thyself to religious actions.

Spiritual Interpretation:

Worldly people perform actions with the desire to gain material happiness. Due to that inclination they are tied to the earth through incarnations. The sincere yogi, however, should perform those selfless good actions which will quicken his evolution.

Most people think they are practicing religious rites by performing ordinary ceremonies. That is better than worldly actions, but such rites produce no wisdom unless their purpose is understood.

The yogi withdraws his life from the sensory motor nerves and pours that energy into the bonfires of life gathered in the seven occult nerve centers. This is practicing Yajna, the real fire rite which the Hindu scriptures enjoin.

When the outward rite is done with the proper chanting and concentration —it produces some result even in worldly people and diverts their minds from material objects to the spiritual calmness within. But when such rites are habitually performed with absent-mindedness they produce little or no benefits. The Fire Rite

When the yogi learns to switch off the life-current from the sensory motor nerves he finds his mind disconnected from the senses. This act of withdrawing life from the body and uniting that energy with the light of God is the real fire rite—burning the little life in the great fire of God, burning all human desire in the divine desire for God. Then the yogi takes his sense withdrawn mind and casts it into the fire of cosmic consciousness; realizing his own soul as something entirely different from the body, he casts that Self into the fire of Eternal Spirit.

The formal rite in India of pouring melted butter—a form of energy—in the fire is symbolical of uniting life-energy with cosmic energy. The esoteric fire rite of life —in which the bodily life is united with the cosmic life, and the human

mind and soul are united with the cosmic mind and Spirit—is composed of actions which should be performed by every spiritual aspirant. Of course the method should be learned from a true guru-preceptor. The followers of such spiritual actions do not remain tied to the earth, but are liberated. In the above stanza the Bhagavad Gita tells all people to practice such methods inwardly even if they also have to work in the world.

Yet, ordinary people who work in the factory of life with only their desires as tools, and without any spiritual training, reap mostly sorrow; just as an untrained mechanic who tries to handle an intricate piece of machinery gets hurt. So the Gita advises all to perform the soul-redeeming activities of meditation, devotion, divine love; helping others and attaining moral culture, as the purifying spiritual fire rite in which all mortal blemishes are burned out

In other words, the Gita emphasizes the necessity of activity as an inevitable condition of life; but it then explains that spiritual activity is the only way to happiness and that it should be performed in all states of human life—in business or in renunciation.

The Goal of Action

The Gita warns that it is foolish to work when actuated by selfish desires, which so often militate against the divine plan. To fulfill his self-created, ever-increasing desires, the worldly man has to reincarnate again and again until he is free. But the yogi who works to please God alone is free. He fulfills his divine mission on earth and becomes liberated soon after death. The Gita says that even the spiritual fire rite of burning ignorance in the flames of wisdom must be performed solely with the desire to please God, and not because of spiritual ambition. The divine man must perform right actions for God only, whereas the worldly man is inclined to perform wrong actions in obedience to the entangling, desire-creating, short-sighted ego.

Yajna means literally Vishnu, or cosmic fire, and consists of religious rites in which the soul offers to merge itself in the cosmic fire.

Chapter 111, Stanza 10

Literal Translation:

The Prajapati (Creator), along with Yajna (the fire of cosmic wisdom), having made mankind in the beginning, said, "By this shalt thou propagate; this will be the milch-cow of thy propensities."

Poetic Rendition:

The Creator formed all human creatures after the image of His illumination. He commanded, "This milch-cow of Divine Wisdom shall offer milk of happiness to all thy desires and thou shall multiply thyself after the image of light in which thou wert made."

Spiritual Interpretation:

Expressing through the conscience in man, God said, "Ye shall develop and nourish thyself through the fountain of true discrimination within thee." As the motherless child is nourished by the milk of the cow, so the devotee—orphaned without the contact of God—may feed all his mental powers with the milk of wisdom. Man may always direct himself through inner guidance, in every phase of his material, mental and spiritual life.

The yogi, during meditation, beholding the astral light and receiving spiritual perceptions, should not remain content with that inner joy but should ever follow the divine wisdom, poured out through intuition, to higher and higher

realms of spiritual advancement.

The meditating devotee beholds lights, supernatural beings and many spiritual manifestations, and is empowered with many miracles. The Bhagavad Gita, in this stanza, exhorts all devotees who seek the palace of highest emancipation not to be sidetracked nor tarry in the beautiful garden of miraculous powers and thus cease to aspire to the ultimate light of wisdom which alone can lead to the highest goal and quench all the accumulated desires of incarnations. Chapter 111, Stanza 11

Literal Translation:

Prajapati (the Creator of praja or beings) said: "With this (fire offering), meditate on the devas (shining angels), and may the astral angels think of thee; thus communing with one another, thou shall receive the Supreme Good."

Poetic Rendition:

"First commune by meditation with cosmic agents who govern the worlds, and thus be eligible to unite with the Ultimate Spirit, Creator of all astral angels who supervise the workings of this ordered universe."

A literal interpretation of this stanza means that, through fire oblations and chants, one should invoke the astral beings, superior to man in the order of evolution, who carry on the cosmic functions. Thus, man will create good karma which will free his life from the hazards of sudden fruition of effects from unseen evil causes set in motion by him in the past.

Materially-minded people live their days in a wooden stupor, by the "sweat of their brows", like the mule which carries a huge bag of gold; this treasure is not only of no use to him, through his complete ignorance, but is the cause of his active suffering, through its weight. Worldly men, like the dumb animal, carry the heavy burden of material duties, suffering and fearing, but reaping little benefit from the onerous labors they perform. They only eat, sleep, earn and procreate, giving not a single thought to the spiritual government underlying human life. When misfortune visits such men, they call it ill-luck or accident. When good fortune arrives, they call it luck or chance. Few realize that their lives are governed by the effects of past actions (karma) and that they are subject to universal laws administered by higher beings.

The Gita therefore points out that, instead of leading an ignorant life, one should perform certain ,spiritual ceremonies, outlined by saints, to place one's self in harmony with high astral beings, thus bringing about a conscious control of life's happenings. The following of certain astrological injunctions, based on the mathematical or orderly nature of the unified cosmos —when such advice is received from Self-realized sages, and not from the superficial professional caster of horoscopes as help to invoke the blessings of astral beings. This salutary result comes about through the righteous observance of astral or unseen laws which govern the universal structure.

Hastening Man's Evolution

Contact with advanced astral beings elevates man, who may thus avoid the fructification of evil karma; misfortune can thus be greatly lessened, while the liberating effects of good actions are enhanced. Man and his astral preceptors in higher realms, by mutual communion can find great good and control destiny. Eventually, by constant contact with spiritual forces, the soul of man comes into harmony with the Supreme Creator. Organizer of all higher and lower beings. The worldly man, unable consciously to commune with astral beings, gains the same result by associating with earthly angels—true God-knowing saints and by

following their counsel.

Spiritual Interpretation:

A deeper interpretation of this stanza can only be understood by advanced yogis. It follows: Withdraw the life-force from the muscles, efferent and afferent nerves, heart and other centers, and unite it with the subtler nerve currents in the spine—the coccyx, sacral, lumbar, dorsal and cervical regions, where dwell, respectively, the five astral angels—Ganesh, god of success; goddess of power; the Creator, god of fire, Vishnu, god of preservation; Shiva, god of dissolution.

These five spinal deities sustain the human body and are diverse manifestations of One Spirit. The yogi should let the life current automatically flow from the lower spinal centers to the higher ones by mental pushes of concentration. He should never be unduly attracted to the beauty of one center, for thus he would remain locked there, unable to proceed to the medulla and the cranial or highest center.

The five spinal deities are called the temporary form of Spirit, as in time they are dissolved in the higher centers. After the yogi can direct his life-force to the throne of light occupied by each of the five temporary deities, he learns to withdraw the current and unite it in the medullary center and the Christ center, at the point between the two eyebrows—the single or spiritual eye where the Changeless Spirit dwells on the thousand-rayed throne in the cranium, the principal seat of the individualized Spirit, or soul.

In the astral withdrawal of life force, the yogi perceives his blue life current commingling with the variously colored currents in the five spinal centers, and is also cognizant of the different states of consciousness resident in and characteristic of each of them. In the astral withdrawal, the yogi is principally concentrated on visible lights and other phenomena.

The Spiritual Eye

But during a higher or spiritual withdrawal of mind from the body through the centers, the yogi, after experiencing the outstanding states of consciousness present in the five regions, then unites the current with the Christ Consciousness prevailing in the spiritual eye. The medullary center in the back of the head, and the divine center in the forehead, both contain Christ Consciousness and are its two poles. As they thus act in conjunction, they may be spoken of as one center.

The yogi who has reached his goal of the Christ center is then able to unite himself with Cosmic Consciousness, perceived in the brain as a starting-point. He then feels his mind united simultaneously in Christ Consciousness—present throughout all vibratory creation—and Cosmic Consciousness, which exists beyond the limits of any vibratory phenomena.

In the superior spiritual withdrawal, even though the yogi perceives lights and astral beings, he dissolves them in the different states of consciousness in the spine. He first unites his mind with semi, sub and super consciousness, in the three lower spinal centers: coccygeal, sacral, lumbar — then lifts his mind to unite it with the higher superconsciousness present in the dorsal and cervical regions. Then he unites himself with Christ and finally Cosmic Consciousness — with the Omnipresent Mind first in creation, then in the vibrationless realms beyond.

This interpretation, then, is the higher meaning of Stanza 11 in Chapter III of the Gita: The yogi should first commune with higher forms of consciousness in the spinal centers and thus become eligible to unite with the Higher Good. the Spirit, in creation as Kutastha Chaitanya or Christ Consciousness, and beyond creation as Brahma Chaitanya or Cosmic Consciousness.
Unity Through Self Realization

True friendship is broad and inclusive. Selfish attachment to a single individual, excluding all others, inhibits the development of divine friendship. You must extend the boundaries of the glowing kingdom of your love, gradually including within them your family, your neighbors, your community, your country, all countries; in short, all living sentient creatures. Also be a cosmic friend, imbued with kindness and affection for all of God's Creation, scattering love everywhere.

How Science Helps

Science is directly helping man with material comforts through her golden inventions. The same science, indirectly, is helping man to be the reformer of dogmatic religions and to explain many miracles found in nature and spoken of in religion. Science shows how, by changing the vibration of a pound of water into ice, that solidified water, instead of mixing and sinking, can be made to float on top of the water. It suggests through the scientific imagination that perhaps Jesus controlled the psychological relation between matter and mind and thus changed the atomic vibration of His body, enabling Him to walk on water. The Art of Right Living

It seems as if God is trying to evolve the art of right living by expressing His Truth through a combination of particular civilizations, mentalities, and nationalities. No nation is complete in itself. An absorption and collection of the best in all nationalities may supply us with the best information on the art of living. It is important to note that Jesus, and the Master Minds of India, not only attained the best in all civilizations since the earliest era to the present time, but they manifested the highest ideals embodied in all religions. Therefore, the art of right living can be found in the study of the best in all nationalities, plus the study of the individual lives of great Saints. People build their aspirations and form their desires according to their pre-natal and post-natal influences. Heredity and national, social, and family characteristics, tastes, and habits mold the life of a child. Children, in the beginning of their lives, are about the same everywhere, but, as they grow older and the family and social characteristics begin to exercise their influence, it is then that individuals begin to reveal national and racial traits.

Meditation Plus Activity

Right meditation balanced with activity must be the cry of Christian, Hindu, and all religionists, as the only savior. The question of your redemption from the self created prison of ignorance must be settled directly by yourself with God. Follow fearlessly the Truth wherever you perceive it. Do not be sidetracked to dogmatic untested religious beliefs, but try to find the one highway of Self Realization which leads quickly to God through the forests of belief and theology. The entire process of evolution in nature and man seems to suggest the necessity of removing the storm of ignorance in order to effect the union of delusion-projected waves of life with the One Ocean of Spirit. SECOND COMING OF CHRIST

Steps Toward the Attaining of the Consciousness Which was in Christ Jesus Christ Describes Heaven, Not as a Point of Space, but as Omnipresence By PARAMHANSA YOGANANDA

Then came to him the mother of Zebedee's children with her sons, worshipping him, and desiring a certain thing of him. And he said unto her, What wilt thou? She saith unto him, Grunt that there my two sons may sit, the one on thy right hand, and the other on thy left, in thy kingdom.

But Jesus answered and said, Ye know not what ye ask. Are ye able to drink of the cup that I shall drink of, and to be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with? They say unto him. We are able.

And he saith unto them. Ye shall drink indeed of my cup, and be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with: but to sit on my right hand, and on my left, is not mine to give, but it shall be given to them for whom it is Prepared of my Father. And when the ten heard it, they were moved with indignation against the two brethren.

But Jesus called them unto him and said, Ye know that the princes of the Gentiles exercise dominion over them, and they that are great exercise authority

upon them.

But it shall not be so among you: but whosoever will be great among you, let him be your minister.

And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your servant: Even as the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many. Matt. 20:20-28.

"You know not what a stupendous thing you are asking. Are you able to drink wisdom from the cup of cosmic consciousness that I shall drink of? Are you baptized with cosmic bliss, the baptism with which I am baptized?" They said to him, "We are able." And Jesus replied, "You are worthy to drink wisdom from the same cup, and you will be baptized with the same cosmic bliss, the cosmic vibration of the Holy Ghost with which I am baptized. But to sit on my right hand or on my left hand at a point of space cannot be arranged by me, because the Heavenly Father enthrones all spiritualized souls in omnipresence." Biblical scholars who profess to find no definition of heaven by Jesus in the Gospels do not understand the hidden sense of his words. In this passage, Christ rejects any notion of heaven as a limited locality, thus indicating its omnipresent nature.

When the disciples heard the request they were indignant against the two brothers, James and John. But Jesus called them to him and said to them, "You know which rulers are appointed to rule over the Gentiles and exercise lordship over them, and you know also the great rulers who exercise authority over the leaders who govern the Gentiles. But that kind of government, with higher officials ruling the lower ones, cannot be among you who are the children of God and are all equal in His eyes and made in His image.

"Anyone who wants to be great among you shall serve all and be the servant of all; and whosoever wants to be the supreme one in heaven's eyes, shall serve all, physically, mentally, morally, and spiritually. For the Christ consciousness in me came not to be served but to serve all, and to offer the example of divine light through sacrifice and ideal living, that others following the example may be redeemed and attain cosmic consciousness." In the above words, Jesus emphasizes that all souls and all disciples of Christ teachings, who are able to attain the wisdom and bliss of Christ consciousness and the perception of the cosmic vibration, will be enthroned in the omnipresence of God, and will be equal, having attained the same eternal God. He also advises us that to be the greatest in divine eyes, one should be the least in material eyes, serving all in every way. Jesus points out that the Christ consciousness in him did not materialize on earth to gather the adoration of people, but to offer the highest service to them by demonstrating divine consciousness in acts of supreme physical, mental and spiritual sacrifice.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

OUR HIDDEN POWERS

Question: "How does the power of free choice help us?

Answer: In the creation of human beings, God has given the key to freedom. Life is the result of design, the law of karma, and the power of free choice. Free choice can change the designs of God. It can do away with the law of karma (action).

God is not subject to karma. We have the same power, as we are made in His image, so why be afraid? If we have a sick body, or a certain heredity, that does not matter, for we have the power to change it at will. We Can Change All Nature

We can modify all the changes in nature. Although there is a design in our life according to the entire creation of this universe, we can change that design. That is why Jesus walked on the water and, that is why He permitted men to crucify Him— saying: "I will build this body temple again in three days." That is why Jesus fed the crowd with five loaves of bread and two fishes. There are two other ways he could have satisfied them; first, by taking the crumbs and giving the men the thought that they were filled, or second, by materializing from nothing, bread sufficient to feed them.

Although man is subject to biological astrological and other laws, the life of Jesus shows that fully developed man has freedom to create a new design. Human life is partially designed; however, it can be changed by wisdom and will power. In infinite ways we can improve our body and the design of our life. Therefore, in human life we find God's greatest blessings.

When we are highly developed, we can do anything. Even without thinking of miracles we see that we have caused a lot of changes in this life, by inventions and discoveries in our outer environment. Man has unlimited power, even to change the seasons and the size

of the earth. We do not realize how much power we have. As children of God, we have accomplished many great works. We are made in the image of the Infinite Designer and hence are creating new designs all the time. Originally God created everything, but later He gave His children power to create according to certain laws.

Because we see only the outer design, we have lost sight of God; we observe that nature; His design, is creating everything imperfectly and therefore we think nothing perfect is behind it.

Remember the Lives of Saints

When in doubt, we must remember the life of saints. Being human beings endowed with power, why should we whine at old age AND disease and sorrow? We should look after the body as best we can, but should not succumb to any fear or be entombed in ignorance. The body is not the whole man.

Of course there is more good in the world than evil, because God is the greatest power. When evil comes to us, we think that we cannot overcome it. We cannot escape the ravages of evil, but we can overcome its influence over our mind. God has given us power to know that nothing here can really hurt us. Life was not given to destroy us but to bring the infinite Immortality of God into our consciousness. Remember that.

Creation Bears Witness

All creation bears witness to the certainty of immortality. We can quicken our evolution because God has given us power to will and to reason in order to reach the highest rungs of wisdom and power and bliss.

IS GOD A MAGICIAN?

Question: "Why is God sometimes called a 'Divine Magician?'"
Answer: In this vast world, God, the Divine Magician, is showing us the phenomena of the world and all kinds of magic. We are His audience. We wonder about His vast creation. God's main purpose was that we, made in His image were to be entertained by His world of magic, but this entertainment has turned into tragedy because we do not understand the aim of the Divine Magician. When we see a human magician perform feats, the tricks seem to be real. Likewise, God has made the un realities of life seem real. This whole universe is a play of force, but we see it as solids, liquids and gases. Our attention has wandered from the

within to the without. If we turned within, we would, find out the truth of life. We have to watch behind the scenes to discover even the tricks of the human magician, as well as of God. Before we can tell other people that this world is all a delusion, we must first know that it is.

Difference Between Pleasure and Pain

Health and disease and pleasure and pain are the greatest trouble makers, because we have given them a reality they do not posses. Health is a likable thought, and disease is a very troublesome thought. If you smile when heathly and cry when in pain, that is acknowledging that you are being deceived. If it is possible to wake up from a dream and realize that it is only a thought, that the experience there of being a strong man was only a crystallization of thought, why can you not wake up from this dream of life and know that you should not be deceived by the qualities of psychological and physical experience? You are Spirit. You must be free from the limitations of opposite thoughts.

SCIENCE DIGEST STAR MAY CLARIFY BIRTH OF PLANETS The elliptical-shaped star, the first non-round star ever seen, which was described in a report from Harvard's South African observatory, holds the promise of new information about cosmic evolution.

The South African director, Dr. J. S. Paraskevopoulos, suggested that the star may be an example of the cataclysm which creates planetary systems, which are earths like ours and the rest of the sun's family.

This observation comes on the heels of two of the most sensational astronomical discoveries ever made, both almost positive evidence of the existence of planets in far-off space, the first ever found. Both discoveries were made within the last year and lost in the war news.

The Harvard observation, while it does not yet necessarily mean that planets are being formed, fits in with other recent observations and theories which would make formation of planets fairly frequent, instead of, as thought until a few years ago, one of the rarest things in creation. In fact, now the possibility of so many other planets is visioned, there is a chance that somewhere there is another earth just like ours, even to the climate.

The two new planets have not been seen directly, but their presence was detected by the gravitational pulls they put on their parent stars, pulls which dragged those stars a little off their proper orbits. —Howard W. Blakeslee, Associated Press Science Editor.

GIANT CLOUDS SPEED AT 90,000 MILES PER HOUR

Tremendous winds are blowing through the heavens. Out in the seemingly eternally quiet, vacant realms between the stars there is a turbulence greater than anything known on earth. Terrific blasts are rushing across the starscape. Gigantic clouds are sweeping through space, blotting out billions of stars as our storm clouds blot out the sun. We have long known about the existence of these clouds, but recently the astronomers have been able to demonstrate that they are moving with high velocities.

Dr. Walter S. Adams director of the Mt. Wilson Observatory, near Los Angeles, has been making measurements of the interstellar cloud masses in regions of the sky in or bordering on the Milky Way, that path of stars across the sky which indicates the plane of the disk-like structure of our local universe.

While many of the cloud masses in the heavens are made up mainly of hydrogen a gas so light that it is practically absent from the earth's atmosphere, the clouds recently studied have been found to be composed of a much heavier substance, calcium, a metal, Dr. Adams announces in a recent issue of the University of Chicago's Astrophysical Journal.

Calcium is a fairly common element on the earth, an ingredient of many rocks, and is an element essential to life. It is the chief constituent of our bones and gives them the rigidity and strength that enables them to bear the weight of the body and give it its shape. It is essential in other ways, too, in the body's chemical economy. We obtain it from milk and vegetables and, as far as money is concerned, it is probably the most expensive of the common essential elements, because it does not occur in foodstuffs in great amounts.

Clouds of Vast Extent

In the heavens, however; clouds of calcium of tremendous extent exist, according to the revelations of the sensitive spectroscopes at Mt. Wilson Observatory which tell the scientists not only the composition of the clouds, but their motions.

Heavy clouds of calcium vapor were found by Dr. Adams in the constellations Cygnus, Sagittarius and Orion. So extensive are these clouds that light, traveling at the rate of 186,000 miles a second, requires, he said, years to

pass through them. In one year light travels 6,000,000,000,000 miles, or about 65,000 times the distance from the sun to the earth.

These tremendous clouds, Dr. Adams finds, are moving at speeds as high as twenty-five miles a second. This is 1,500 miles a minute, or 90,000 miles an hour. This is 1,000 times faster than the winds of hurricanes that do so much damage when they move over the surface of the earth.

There is no uniformity in the distribution of these dust clouds throughout space. They are found most frequently in the Milky Way and in the region close to it.

In the direction of the constellation Sagittarius, says Dr. Adams, there are two clouds, one in front of the other. The cloud nearest the earth is traveling toward the stars of Sagittarius at the rate of 2.5 miles a second, and the farther cloud is moving away from the earth at more than thirteen miles a second.

Sagittarius is on a line with the center of our universe. No one has ever seen this center, as it is obscured by the clouds which Dr. Adams has been studying. These clouds are undoubtedly a most fortunate protecting screen for us. It is probable that there is at the center of our galaxy a great spherical cluster made up of billions of brilliant stars. Around this unseen cluster there is, in the region of Sagittarius, a greater density of stars than in any other part of the sky.

Observers state that in the high, clear parts of the tropics the light from the stars in Sagittarius is sufficient to enable one to read a newspaper outdoors on a moonless night.

Light of Surpassing Brilliancy

In the hidden regions of this constellation there is, if our galaxy has the same structure throughout as millions of other galaxies which it otherwise resembles, a ball-like center giving light of surpassing brilliance and intensity. It would undoubtedly shine in the night sky with greater brilliance than that with which our sun illuminates the day. The rays from this central nucleus, if they reached us, might not prove to be as beneficial to life as those we receive from the sun.

Rushing toward this center of the universe, and screening us from it, are the two cloud masses described by Dr. Adams. The one nearest the center is rushing toward it at the rate of almost 50,000 miles an hour, while the one farther away is moving at the slower speed of almost 10,000 miles an hour.

If we could see our galaxy from outer space, it would look like a whirlwind of stars with a brilliant center and trailing streams of stars surrounding it. —By John J. O'Neill, in "New York Herald Tribune."

X-RAY MACHINES IN PINCH OF SALT

In a pinch of common potassium salt, science can find combined X-ray machines and clocks, according to a discovery which came to light recently.

Atoms of the mineral potassium act as X-ray producing machines. From time to time a certain number of atoms hurl out such rays. Also, they change themselves into the rare element argon, which is found as a gas in the atmosphere.

This new discovery about potassium, a substance essential in diet for proper working of the human body, and abundant in the surface minerals of the earth, has been made by two English scientists, Professor F. C. Thompson and Dr. S. Rowlands of the University of Liverpool.

Scientists have known that potassium atoms change themselves from time to time into calcium atoms. When this happens each changing atom shoots off a tiny electron, the smallest particle of matter loaded with negative electricity.

But the British scientists have found a new property of potassium, that its granules also generate X-rays, and are themselves transformed-into argon. X-rays are known to the public as the form of visible light which penetrates otherwise opaque materials. These rays are used in making photographic shadow pictures of the human body to find out any buried bullets or other under-the-skin unusual developments.

But the X-ray producing property of the metal potassium is likely to be particularly interesting for geologists who study the age of the earth, and of its various rocks.

The rate at which potassium changes itself into argon, giving out X-rays, is extremely slow.

It takes 400,000,000 years for a given lump of the metal to be half changed into argon. Hence, in nature, the process of the transformation of one element into another has a peculiar interest as a timekeeper of the earth's own development. Measurement of argon in rocks might be done, and help scientists in understanding how certain kinds of rocks were formed. -By Gobind Behari Lal, International New
